RESIDENCE ORDINANCE

PUEBLO OF ISLETA, NEW MEXICO

WHEREAS the Constitution for the Pueblo of Isleta, approved
March 27, 1947, under Article II, Membership, and Ordinance No. 28,
approved April 17, 1950, regulate and govern residency with the Pueblo; and

WHEREAS tradition and customs have regulated and governed residency of members and non-members married into the Pueblo of Isleta, as well as other non-members, and

WHEREAS Pueblo tradition and customs regulating and governing residency within the Pueblo of Isleta should be further formalized in writing;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED THAT:

Section 1. All members of the Pueblo shall first obtain approval from the Governor and the Tribal Council before renting, leasing or lending buildings, houses or land to non-members of the Pueblo for temporary or permanent use as residence within the Pueblo.

Section 2. All members residing within the Pueblo who are married to non-members of the Pueblo shall promptly report their marriages to the Governor and the Council. All such members that plan to reside in the Pueblo or on Pueblo land with non-members must first obtain permission from the Governor and the Tribal Council before taking up residence. If permission is granted by the Governor and the Tribal Council, the non-member spouses of the members must sign an agreement that they will respect and will abide with the laws, rules and regulations of the Pueblo. Any failure of a Pueblo member of the non-member spouse to respect and conform to the laws,
