### FROM THE OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR

s we welcome the new year, as well as new 2017 tribal officials, I want to first give thanks to our Creator, from whom all our blessings flow; to the people of Isleta who have placed their faith and confidence in me; and to my 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Lt. Governors, Max Zuni and Andrew Teller, who have accepted the responsibility of assisting me in serving our people this term. Both these men come from respected and traditional Isleta families and bring with them a wealth of knowledge and experience in tribal government. Rounding up my administration staff are Bobby Cherino and Kevin Lente, who will be serving as Tribal Sheriffs. I ask that you afford my administrative staff with your total cooperation.

We face many challenges this year both here in Isleta and on the national level. First and primary with my administration has to be the education of our youth. I am also concerned with employment of our people, economic development and building and maintaining the strong political ties that Isleta enjoys with our local, state, tribal and national leaders. Together with our Tribal Council, we have the ability to overcome many of the issues that face our people. Let us strive towards making Isleta a better place to live and raise our families.

I am reminded of the words of Father George Gries during the formal Blessing of the Canes ceremony on Sunday, January 15, 2017, in St. Augustine Church that we, as government officials, should not forget that we were elected or appointed to serve our people and not the other way around. And I am reminded that we, as public servants serve all of the people, and not just certain segments of the community. I am also aware that we must speak for those who cannot speak, the young, the old, the disabled and we do this as is our tradition that has been passed down to us since time immemorial. But I must also remind all that we are but mortal men. possessing no super powers or above anyone else in the community. Our actions and our conduct must nonetheless be above reproach. I promise to do my best to earn your respect and confidence, and I only ask for your good thoughts and prayers to help us achieve this. These are the responsibilities that we take upon ourselves as we accept our traditional canes of office. The sanctity and the responsibilities of our canes cannot be dismissed or violated as they are imbued with the knowledge that has been passed down to us by all those leaders who have come before us. To this, we pledge our faith and total commitment.

There are many who feel distant or disenfranchised from tribal government. Let us unite or at least, attempt to do so. Let us put aside our petty differences that divide our people and place our priorities on all those great things that make us a proud Isleta community. The doors to my office will always be open to those who wish to be heard.

I do not forget that we are the acculturation and assimilation of many hundreds of years of indigenous people who have come together to be known as Isleta people. We are strong and resilient, proud keepers of the centuries old traditions and culture handed down to us by our forefathers. And we stand together as men and women, young and old, rich in that which our fathers and mothers left us. We are the face of the Isleta Pueblo people, looking towards the future, but ever cognizant of our rich past. We are the descendants of the great Pueblo Indian cultures that flourished many hundreds of years ago, and we are also the pioneers of the future to come.

### **News from the Comanche Ranch**

s I sit here writing this article the snow is falling over Ladron Peak. Since the beginning of the year we have been blessed with over 2 inches of rain and more is on the way. All this moisture means that we will have excellent range conditions with healthy plant life and water in the dirt tanks. In order to measure the health and diversity of the range the Natural Resources department will soon begin a range-monitoring project here at the ranch. This is something that is extremely important since it will determine the types of forage and forbs; noxious and invasive weeds; levels of use and will help in establishing a pasture rotation system. It will also aide in establishing the number of livestock (carrying capacity) that can be grazed without

> I have seen a few new calves on the ground and the calving season should begin in earnest in the next 3 months. As the cows begin having their calves their nutritional needs increase since they must now produce milk plus provide for her own needs. What makes it even harder is that the grass is dormant this time of the year and does not provide much nutrition. In order to meet those needs we must put out supplemental mineral blocks and provide some cow hay. The key though is to make sure the cows are in good condition BEFORE the grass goes dormant. Therefore we provide mineral supplements year-round and we vaccinate and

worm the entire herd in a timely manner.

With that being said I would like to know what kinds of trainings the livestock producers of Isleta would like to have made available to them. I would like to use the ranch as a training ground for things such as vaccination schedule and protocols; supplemental feeding program; range monitoring and low-stress handling. I belong to several livestock organizations and have access to many training sources and I would like to host various trainings and I need your input. ### FUTURE HOME FOR A COMMUNITY RECEPTION HALL

small parcel off TR 2 was home to the former historic Old Head Start believed to be dated to the 1940-1950s. Many Pueblo of Isleta community members and families have fond memories of their experiences while attending the historic school and the future plans commit to building a facility that will bring current and future generations continued reflection and lasting memories by creating a home for a new Reception Hall that will facilitate up to 200 people.

This project was originally approved in 2014 with a scope and budget to demolish the majority of the former buildings on the site, but to retain the original Old Head Start as part of a remodeling/rebuilding effort for a new Reception Hall. During the original demolition of the site in 2015, items of concern were brought to the staff's attention that would impact some of the remodeling efforts with the original building.

In the early months of 2016 a structural engineer was brought in to assess the building's original construction to include the roof trusses, floor joints, interior/exterior walls, and foundation. One of the biggest factors the Pueblo considered when originally planning to remodel the facility was the belief that the building was primarily built out of adobe; however, during the assessment after the interior drywall was removed, it was determined that the majority of the exterior walls consisted of unreinforced clay bricks and wood construction that would have been a challenge to reinforce. In addition, it was determined that an interior wall that divided the building was a load bearing wall that would require the construction of 4-5 support beams to support the roof structure as part of a remodeling effort. It was also identified that replacement of the floor trusses and roof joints would be required due to water damage.

Many questions have come up about the building's status and eligibility for the National Historical Registry. Although the building may have

qualified for an evaluation and nomination in order to be included on the National Register, the direct benefits to the Pueblo would have been minimal. There are not a lot of historic preservation grants available and if the Pueblo qualified for any grants that were tied to Federal Funding it may have required the Pueblo to seek concurrence from an Advisory Council on remodeling efforts that may need to meet the Secretary of Interior's Standards for Rehabilitation. A lot of incentives tied to a Historical Registry are based on tax credits of which the Pueblo does not qualify.

With hesitation and after careful discussions involving the age of the building, original construction material, costs for remodeling vs. new construction, and the pros/cons for Historical Registry, it was decided with former leadership that remodeling the building was going to be cost prohibitive and would not have allowed for the desired open space within the building footprint as originally planned. The decision to demolish the historic building is going to allow for a better use of the property, more options for relocating the supporting infrastructure to include parking to support 200 people, electricity, gas, water, and a larger septic system that is currently undersized for the size of a Reception Hall that is planned. The staff will make every effort to provide a facility that will provide the community with a wonderful location to gather and hold various events. As the project moves forward to procure a design/construction team that will be responsible for developing a new site plan and the desired amenities, community members are encouraged to submit any recommendations to the Public Services Department Director, Ms. Shawna Ballay, at poi17501@isletapueblo.com. Based on the staff's current project load we anticipate the selection of the project team will commence in the spring of 2017. Thank you for your patience and we will provide updates on the design and construction schedule as this project moves forward.

# HOME SERVICES PROGRAM

By Patricia l. Lucero, Home services manager

Home Services provides a range of services to elders who meet the minimal criteria: 60 years or older with 2 or more ADLs (Activities of Daily Living Limitations). Public Assistance Services-elders 60 years and above; with no ADLs. Elder must live and reside within the Pueblo of Isleta.

### Home Services Program (Non-Medical Services)

Qualifying Criteria: Elders 60 years of age or older with two (2) or more ADLs; or a younger disabled person under the age of 60 who has two (2) or more ADLs, lives with their elder parents who are responsible for providing support services.

Attendants provide 3 - 4 hours of service per week to clients in the comfort of their own home. Light housekeeping: mopping, sweeping, vacuuming, dusting, dish washing, laundry and meal preparation, etc.

• Personal Care services: bathing, showering, dressing, grooming and medication reminders.

• Transportation: available to assist clients with errands and outings.

• Advocacy: referrals for Public Assistance or providing information and assistance.

• Respite Care: provides relief to a full-time caregiver of a frail homebound elder 60 years or older who is unable to perform two (2) or more ADLs. Services are the same as described above.

### **Benefits** Assistance

Application and referral for Public Resources. Again, this is for elders 60 years and above.

Resources includes: Commodities, Food stamps, Low Energy Assistance Program, New Mexico Weatherization Program on Tribal Lands, PNM Good Neighbor Fund, PNM Home Check Program, POI Housing, POI Tribal Programs etc....

**QUESTION?** What are Activities of Daily Living Limitations: assistance for: eating, bathing, dressing, taking medicine and going to the bathroom.

# **Helping Your Adult Family Member Who Is Intoxicated**

thdrawal from substance abuse, especially alcohol, can be dangerous and medical attention is recommended. When dealing with an intoxicated member of your family, the first thing that might come to mind is bring them to the Isleta Behavioral Health Services (IBHS). If you do bring them to our office, you will be directed to go to the MATS Detox Program in Albuquerque. You can call the MATS staff in advance and talk to them about any questions or concerns you may have before going. If your family member is accepted, make sure he/she takes three (3) pairs of underwear and socks and have them wear comfortable warm clothing like sweat pants and shirt (no packed bag of clothes). That is all your family member needs for the 3 to 7 day stay.

After your family member is checked in/ dropped off at MATS Detox, you can return home. Your family member will be fine either way; he/she is not in a locked facility and can leave at any time. Please practice "tough love" by not picking your family member up unless they have been cleared by MATS Detox for release. Once your family member returns home, please encourage your family member to call IBHS and request an appointment for an intake assessment. The intake assessment helps determine the best course of treatment to help them. Treatment recommendations may include residential treatment or outpatient services.

Isleta Behavioral Health's on-site outpatient services include the Early Recovery Skills Group, Another Recovery Technique Group, AA, and individual counseling. We do provide transportation for any family member who lives in the Isleta Community to attend our activities. Please call 869-5475 to schedule a ride.

**Please Note:** the MATS Detox Program is for Bernalillo county residents only and IBHS does not transport clients to this facility, which is located at 5901 Zuni Road SE, ABQ (one block west of San Pedro, phone: 505-468-1555). Finally, if your family member does not get accepted to this program, you can take them to the emergency room.

Cancer is the <u>second leading cause of death among Americans</u>. It's important to do what you can to help prevent this disease. The easiest and most important thing is to find <u>cancer as early as possible</u>. This is done usually by different early detection methods, several of them are listed below.

Cancer	Risk	Early detection	When to get tested
Colorectal Cancer	Personal or family history	Screening	Mid age or earlier if Dr. suggests

### **QUIT SMOKING COMMERCIAL TOBACCO**

### EAT HEALTHY

Eat more

- Healthy fats, such as raw nuts, olive oil, fish oils, flax seeds, or avocados
- Colorful fruits and vegetables—fresh or frozen, prepared without butter
- High-fiber cereals, breads, and pasta made from whole grains or legumes
- High-quality protein, such as fish, poultry, and lean meats
- Organic dairy such as eggs, skim or whole milk, or un sweetened yogurt

Eat less

- Trans fats from partially hydrogenated or deep-fried foods; saturated fats from fried food, fast food, and snack foods
- Packaged foods, especially those high in sodium and sugar
- White or egg breads, sugary cereals, refined pastas or rice
- Processed meat such as bacon, sausage, and salami, and fried chicken
- Yogurt with added sugar, processed cheese

### Are you at risk?

The top 3 leading causes of death for Native Americans in New Mexico are:

- #1 Unintentional Injury
- #2 Heart Disease
- #3 Malignant Neoplasms (Cancer)
- All 3 of these causes of death can be prevented!

n the next few months we will focus on these LEADING CAUSES OF DEATH FOR NATIVE AMERICANS. Last month we talked about Injury Prevention and Motor Vehicle Crashes. This month we will talk about the #2 cause of death for Native Americans in New Mexico, according to CDC (https://webappa.cdc.gov/ cgi-bin/broker.exe), which is Heart Disease. One factor leading to this is high blood pressure. High blood pressure is a condition that does not always have symptoms, which is why it is important to have it checked at least every 2 years. Once you have it checked, it can actually be controlled through:

eating healthy

- being active (keep your heart rate up for at least 30 minutes)
- sometimes it is necessary to take medication
- losing weight/maintaining a healthy weight
- keeping your cholesterol levels in a healthy range
- reducing the amount of salt in your diet
- not smoking (call 869-4479 to quit smoking)
- maintaining normal blood sugar levels (call 869-4595 for more information

Other ways to prevent heart disease include the list below given from WebMD: 1. Unwind and connect. Find ways to ease stress. Three ideas to try: exercise, meditate, and talk to people you trust.

2. Work on your weight. It's a plus for your heart if you bring it to a healthy level.

3. Upgrade your next meal. Favor fruits, veggies, lean protein, and whole grains. Pass on foods that are salty, high in unhealthy fats, or fried. Repeat for the meal after that, and so on, until it's routine.

4. Make an exercise menu. Pick a couple of activities that sound like fun. That way, you always have some choices about what to do. Exercise at least three to four times a week for 30 minutes at a time. It burns calories and helps keep extra pounds off.

5. Rethink your drink. Limit alcohol. Moderate drinking may be OK, but more than that isn't good for your health. What's moderate drinking? Up to 1 glass a day for women, and up to 2 glasses a day for men.

6. Check your numbers. You may have levels of blood pressure, cholesterol, or blood sugar and not realize it. Your doctor can check all of these things. If any of your numbers are too high, he'll suggest a plan of action.

7. Don't smoke. The tobacco habit isn't just bad for your lungs, it also makes heart disease more likely. Contact the Isleta Health Educator, Stephanie Barela, to find out about the quit smoking programs you can take to learn tips to quitting smoking.
