Governor's Report

Ma-Gu-wam

November is National Native American and Native American Heritage Month. American Indians and Alaskan Natives have handed down invaluable cultural and rich traditions, art, folk tales, literature, religion, language, and American history that continue on to this day. The Department of Veterans observes this month during November. The Veterans Administration reports that American Indians and Alaskan Natives have served in the United States Armed Services with honor and distinction, defending the security of our nation with their lives. It goes on to report that American Indians and Alaskan Natives have the highest record of service per capita compared to other ethnic groups, how great is that, thanks to our Veterans from Isleta Pueblo and Native American Veterans throughout this great Country of ours.

Tribal Leaders from the 19 Pueblos have been meeting with New Mexico Legislators regarding budget cuts that will have great impacts to tribal programs. There are other concerns of business that will impact the tribes that I will report as ongoing negotiations are still on going. These past few years have been hit hard with the economy at its lowest having major impacts to tribal communities. The State of New Mexico is looking for money that may be taken from tribal programs and businesses. Isleta employs approximately

2000 employees throughout our programs and businesses. We employ approximately 85% to 90% Non-Tribal Members that pay Federal and State of New Mexico taxes. Overall we all pay Federal taxes plus State taxes for items purchased off reservation. This is why it is imperative for our people to vote during elections at the Federal, State level, and Tribal elections, it does make a difference.

You have probably heard that Facebook is constructing a data center that is located in Los Lunas, next to the Isleta Boundary west of the WalMart store. Facebook plans to build about six buildings each building will be the size of about six football fields two stories high with 2.9 million square ft. of space. I was invited to visit the site along with Governor Martinez, NM Legislators and the Mayor of Los Lunas. Facebook has hired a large number of contractors to work on the project ranging from electrical, carpentry, sheet metal, refrigeration and more. There will be 1,000 jobs available, and will put some workers on an apprenticeship program. If you are interested or in need of a job, contact Facebook at the site.

Per-Capita will be distributed December 16, 2017 from 8:00am to 12:00pm.

NO hams will be distributed this year due the budget cuts.

2017 Per Capita Second Distribution

At a duly called meeting, the Tribal Council of the Pueblo of Isleta authorized a second 2017 Per Capita distribution for **Tribal Members who** are duly enrolled as of December 31, 2017. The second Per Capita distribution will be in the amount of \$1,250 per Tribal Member. The distribution will be made on Saturday December 16th, 2017 from 8:00 am to 12:00pm at the Pueblo of Isleta New Recreation building. After December 16th, 2017, Per Capita checks may be picked up at the Treasury Office located within the Tribal Service Complex building during normal business hours 8:00am to 4:30pm Monday - Friday. **Distributions not** picked up or requested before March 1, 2018 will be VOID and NO LONGER AVAILABLE. Tribal members requesting their Per Capita check be mailed or picked up by another individual must provide a current, Original Notarized Letter to the Treasury Office (copies will NOT be accepted). For this December 16th, 2017 Per Capita distribution, the Pueblo of Isleta shall not withhold or garnish any amount from any individual Tribal Member.

RESOLUTION NO. 2017-272 2017 PER CAPITA DISTRIBUTION AUTHORIZATION

At a duly called meeting of the Tribal Council of the Pueblo of Isleta, the following resolution was passed:

WHEREAS, the Pueblo of Isleta is a federally recognized Indian tribe with a written Constitution and inherent, sovereign powers;

WHEREAS, the Pueblo of Isleta Tribal Council is empowered by Article V of the Pueblo of Isleta Tribal Constitution to appropriate funds as are necessary for the health, safety, and general welfare of the Pueblo, and for other public purposes and per capita payments to members of the Pueblo, and to manage and control the resources of the Pueblo for the best interest of the Pueblo;

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has considered the advisability of declaring a per capita distribution to Tribal Members and has determined that such distribution be made pursuant to certain criteria as described herein.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the Pueblo of Isleta authorizes a second Per Capita distribution for 2017 as follows:

1. Definitions:

- a. "Tribal Member" shall mean a person duly enrolled with the Pueblo of Isleta as a Tribal Member and approved by the Tribal Council or Tribal Enrollment Committee as of December 31, **2017**.
- b. "Dependent Adult" means a Tribal Member who is, at the time of enactment of this Resolution, eighteen (18) years of age or older and who is in circumstances experiencing difficulties in the transaction of business, such as a Tribal Member being in a hospital, institution or nursing home.

2. Criteria for Distribution:

- a. Each Tribal Member will receive a non-taxable Per Capita distribution of \$1,250 to be distributed in one payment of \$1,250 on Saturday December 16th, 2017 at the Isleta Main Recreation Center from 8am to 12pm. A Tribal ID must be presented to receive the distribution. The entire \$1,250 distribution is nontaxable to each Tribal Member, nor reportable.

 b. Per Capita distribution may be made by mail to Tribal Members not
- b. Per Capita distribution may be made by mail to Tribal Members not living within the Reservation, if the Pueblo of Isleta Treasury Department receives an **original** notarized statement no later than March 1, 2018 requesting that the Per Capita distribution be mailed to the address

- specified in the notarized statement. In addition, Tribal Members whose mailing addresses are incorrect are required to submit to the Census Office a notarized statement showing the following; (1) name, (2) Current mailing address, and (3) that such a person is a Tribal Member enrolled with the Census Office.
- c. A Dependent Adult may designate a person to receive that member's Per Capita payment. The Per Capita distribution check may be made payable to the legal guardian of a Dependent Adult or who may have a valid power of attorney for such Dependent Adult. Documentation must be provided acceptable to the Tribal Treasurer, such as a notarized statement, a Court Order on guardianship, or a valid power of attorney, as the case may be.

3. Distribution Procedures:

- a. Distribution after December 16th, 2017 will be made until March 1, 2018 at the Tribal Service Complex during normal business hours of 8am to 4:30pm. A Tribal ID must be presented to receive the distribution. The rights to distributions for those persons referred to in Paragraph 1(a), 2(b) and 2(c) above will not be impaired.
- b. Distributions not picked up or requested by March 1, 2018 will be void and no longer be available. Distributions to a Tribal Member whose whereabouts are unknown shall be handled according to the Pueblo of Isleta Tribal Enrollment Ordinance and the Tribal Enrollment Committee's Policies and Procedures.

4. Withholding of Distribution:

The Pueblo shall not withhold any amounts from individuals in this Per Capita Distribution.

5. Funding Sources:

Approximately \$5,581,250 million will be withdrawn from the Pueblo of Isleta Proceeds of Labor Account to fund the second 2017 Per Capita Distribution.

We the undersigned, do hereby certify that the foregoing resolution was passed at a duly called meeting of the Tribal Council of the Pueblo of Isleta the 23rd day of October 2017, at which a quorum was present, with 4 voting for, 2 opposing, 1 abstaining.

LETTER FROM THE EDITOR

People whom wish to submit an article or flyer are responsible for generating their own article or flyer. Should you need help, please call the Library at 505.869.9808 and set up a date and time to sit down with a Library staff member whom will help you throughout the process. The Library will NOT accept notes dropped off at the Library or information over the phone to generate your article.

PROBATES need to be published in the Newsletter for two consecutive months. Probates are considered court documents therefore all submitters must provide: 1) Name of Deceased, 2) Date of Deceased 3) Court Case # and 4) Date of Court Date. A Probate form can be found on the Newsletter Archive page at http://www.isletapueblo.com/newsletters.html.

CLASSIFIED ADS: The new administration has requested that the Newsletter start a Classified Ad section for Tribal members selling land, houses, mobile homes, vehicles, and farm equipment. Leasing of houses and mobile homes will be accepted. Smaller items which can be sold at the local flea markets or weekly yard sales will NOT be accepted.

Currently, this service is FREE to Tribal members. Land, houses, and mobile homes must be within the reservation boundaries. Ads must meet the 160 character limit. Ads that exceed the 160 characters will NOT be submitted into the Newsletter. A single picture may be submitted with the ad. Submitters of classified ads are responsible for generating their own ads as this is a FREE service.

As a reminder, Tribal business owners may submit a small flyer at no charge. Like the classified ads, business owners are responsible for generating their own flyers as this is a FREE service.

Classified ads and business flyers will be posted no more than two consecutive months. In the event where the Newsletter may exceed the 24 page limit, classified ads and business flyers will be "bumped" for newsletter articles. Again, this is a FREE service for Tribal members.

The Isleta Newsletter is owned and operated by the Pueblo of Isleta. Therefore, the Governor of the Pueblo of Isleta has the final say of all articles and contents within the Isleta Newsletter.



PUEBLO OF ISLETA PUBLIC SERVICES DEPARTMENT UTILITIES DIVISION

When it comes to sewer service most of us put it in the back of our minds until it's too late. Whether it is slow draining lines, a sewage backup into the home, or a routine septic pumping. When it comes to being a homeowner there are many ways you can help us here at the Utilities Division to mitigate some of the issues that may arise with your sewer system.

This time of the year we all know families come together which means extra baking, cooking, cleaning, and water use. With that being said it raises the possibility of you encountering a problem with your sewer system.

Think at the sink! Avoid washing down grease, flour, coffee grounds, etc., as this can cause partial or total blockage of your drain lines. For those with a septic tank you many think an easy fix is pouring down some drano, liquid plumr, etc., but let's avoid these chemicals as it can harm the living collection of organisms that digest and treat waste in your septic tank. Instead use boiling water, or a drain snake.

Also, let's remind our family and friends who are visiting this holiday season that the toilet is not a trash can. Flushing down items such as paper towels, feminine hygiene products, flushable wipes, etc. are all items that pose a threat to having a blockage in sewer lines.

Check for leaks! Toilets, shower heads, faucets. Simple fixes such as a flapper on a toilet are the cause for unnecessary water waste. Fixing a few leaks around the home will also keep your septic tank from filling up too quickly.

Keep in mind before starting that landscape idea you had in mind for next spring, please consider how it will affect the future of your sewer lines, septic tanks, clean outs, etc. Planting trees or shrubs near any of these areas will allow roots to find water and enter sewer lines. This can pose problems such as blockage, backups, slow draining lines, failed septic systems, etc.

Lastly, we would like to remind you all colder temperatures are on the way. Thoroughly insulate all exposed water lines. Properly shut off your frost free hydrant after every use, detach water hose when done. Be sure to locate your exterior water isolation valve "shut off". Take a note where it's located, or mark to make the location known. These few precautions can help prevent frozen waterlines, cracking, breaking, also damage to your home and property.

















Swimming Pool

QUICK FACTS ON PERSONAL REPRESENTATIVE FORMS

1. **WHY** do I need to have a Personal Representative Form on file for a family member to have access to my medical records?

Every patient 18 and over who receives services at the Health Center is protected by confidentiality rights. The Health Center does not share Protected Health Information to anyone who does not have the legal right.

2. **WHAT** can you do to Grant Access to your Protected Health Information?

If you wish to have a person other than yourself have access to your Protected Health Information, you will be required to fill out a **Personal Representative Form**.


3. WHERE do I get this form?


This form is available in the Medical Records Department.

4. WHAT is Protected Health Information?

Transit Services Now Serving the Pueblo of Isleta



The Pueblo of Isleta and the Rio Metro Regional Transit District are pleased to announce two new transit services now serving the Pueblo

Bus Route 208

Bus Route 208 connects the Pueblo and Valencia County communities to the Alvarado Transportation Center (ATC) in Downtown Albuquerque during the morning/midday when the Rail Runner does not operate. Route 208 features three northbound trips arriving at the ATC at 9:30am, 11:00am and 1:30pm, and three southbound trips departing the ATC at 9:35am, 11:05am and 1:32pm. At the ATC, riders can transfer to ABQ RIDE bus routes.

Route 208 serves two bus stops on the Pueblo of Isleta. The stop closest to the village proper is located on NM 147 just east of the Rio Grande bridge. Please do not park and leave vehicles unattended on the adjoining roads near this stop, as the bus and other vehicles use these roads to turn around and access other locations. Route 208 also stops at the Isleta Pueblo Rail Runner Station, where riders can transfer to the Isleta Resort and Casino shuttle. Because the bus serves the station, riders can also consider using Route 208 in combination with the Rail Runner, for example, taking the bus to Downtown Albuquerque in the mid-morning and returning by train in the evening.

Pueblo of Isleta Dial-a-Ride

The Pueblo of Isleta Dial-a-Ride operates Monday through Friday from 9:00am to 2:00pm, providing trips within the Pueblo and to the ABQ RIDE Route 53 bus stop on NM 314. Limited service to WalMart in Los Lunas will also be provided on Wednesdays from 11:00am to 2:00pm.

Request your Dial-a-Ride trip by calling Valencia County dispatch at (505) 352-3595 before noon at least one business day prior to your trip. Rio Metro will accept requests beginning Wednesday 11/29 for service starting Monday 12/4. Requests are accepted between 8:00am and 5:00pm. On the date and time of your trip, a wheelchair accessible van will arrive within 15 minutes of your scheduled pickup time. Trips may also be grouped together; riders should expect to travel with others.

Schedules for Route 208 are also available at the Public Services Department Office at the Tribal Services Complex.

Community Health Leaders Selected in Eight Tribal Communities in NM

Community Health Leadership Program Launches in Pueblo, Navajo, and Urban Areas

ALBUQUERQUE, NM —November 20, 2017 — Smoke Free Signals, a tribal-serving health education program, recently announced eight awardees for its Community Health Leadership Program.

Smoke Free Signals will mentor the selected Community Health Leaders with the vision to protect all tribal community members from the harms of commercial secondhand smoke. The Community Health Leaders will design and implement a policy action plan



unique to their communities to reduce the acceptability of commercial secondhand smoke in a specific community space. Each Leader will receive \$2,500 for reaching milestones in environmental policy change.

Secondhand smoke is the combination of smoke from the burning end of a cigarette and the smoke breathed out by smokers. Secondhand smoke is toxic and contains over 7,000 chemicals, and has been linked to cancer, sudden infant death syndrome (SIDS), ear infections, and severe asthma.

Awarded health leaders and the communities they will serve include Alexis Garcia (San Felipe Pueblo), Kandyce Garcia (Santo Domingo Pueblo), Corey Herrera (Cochiti Pueblo), Leslee Horn (urban Indian population in International District of Albuquerque), Kyle Jim (Diné), Jody Mike-Bidtah (Diné), Diane Shije (Zia Pueblo), and Louis Tonya (Acoma Pueblo).

Smoke Free Signals is a program that provides commercial tobacco and secondhand smoke awareness tools to the 23 Tribes, Nations, and Pueblos across New Mexico. The resources provided arm Tribal Communities with the tools necessary to implement smoke free environments in an effort to improve the health and wellbeing of these communities. 
