Incumbent will Provide counseling services to adults and children with mental health and/or substance abuse problems in individual, family, or group sessions. Performs community outreach and prevention services by educating and informing the community, schools, local organizations and businesses on substance abuse and mental health related issues. Maintains confidentiality of all privileged information.

Minimum Qualifications/Requirements:

- Bachelor's Degree in Psychology, Social Work, Alcohol and Other Drug Abuse or closely related field.
- Two years' work experience in the Alcohol, Tobacco and Other Drug Abuse Field; or equivalent combination of education and experience.
- State of New Mexico Licensed Professional Clinical Counselor (LPCC).
- State of New Mexico Licensed Independent Social Worker (LISW).
- State of New Mexico Licensed Mental Health Clinician (LMHC) or Licensed Alcohol and Drug Abuse Counselor (LADAC).
- Licensed Substance Abuse Trainee may be considered upon successful completion of LADAC certification within six months.
- CPR Certification.
- Must be able to pass a TB screening.
