## Governor's Report

ABCWUA Sewage System Overflow Affecting the Rio Grande

At approximately 1am, Monday, July 11, 2022, Isleta Police Dispatch notified Lt. Governor Lucero of sewage inflow to the Rio Grande. Lt. Governor Lucero then called 2nd Lt. Governor Sanchez. 2nd Lt. Sanchez, then contacted the Albuquerque Bernalillo County Water Utility Authority (ABCWUA) point of contact. The initial information received was a collapsed sewage main interceptor at 64th and Hanover, in NW Albuquerque. The subject interceptor receives sewage influent from Albuquerque north of I-40 and west of the river with an average daily flow of 12 million gallons. The initial reported sewage system overflow (SSO), was estimated to be eight (8) million gallons, with three (3) million ponded in an Albuquerque Metropolitan Arroyo Flood Control Authority (AMAFCA) storm water pond, and five (5) million gallons reaching the river.

Monday morning, 2nd Lt. Governor Sanchez, notified the Mayordomos of the SSO and inflow into the river. As a precaution the Middle Rio Grande Conservancy District (MRGCD) would discontinue diverting river water at the Isleta Diversion Dam (IDD) which supplies the eastside and Los Charcos. The Mayordomos were also informed the Indian Canal and Acequia Madre irrigation water was not affected by the spill due to the westside supply diverted from the Angostura Diversion above the SSO inflow at I-40 and river. A Public Health Advisory was issued that morning as well.

The SSO was reported to have started at 5:54pm, Sunday, July 10, 2022, and was stopped at 12am, Tuesday, July 12, 2022. The duration was 30 hours and 6 minutes. However, it is not clear when sewage inflow started and stopped entering the river. This is a question, among others that will need to be determined to assess and report the SSO correctly and for any penalties the ABCWUA will be liable imposed by the Environmental Protection Agency.

Based on discussion with MRGCD, and allowing river water to flow past the IDD (opening all gates), and understanding Mayordomos reported a green color in the Chical holding pool. Upon 2nd Lt. Governor investigating and discussion with MRGCD, it was learned water from the Barr Drain/ Canal flowed into the Peralta pool. The Barr was the source of the green color from the vegetation occurring and growing there. The MRGCD flushed the Chical pool and which left some of that vegetation biomass remaining.

Some irrigation re-started on the Cacique and Otero Thursday, July 14. The Big Chical was re-started on Friday, July 15th, and Little Chical on Saturday July 16th.

Friday evening, 2nd Lt. Governor Sanchez met with the Chical Mayordomos and farmers over the WQ concerns for gardens. It was decided that the two (2) drought relief wells that were found recently operational and use of water buffalo would be utilized to supply gardens on the eastside with groundwater before re-starting irrigation with river water. Public works would run those wells and coordinate with Mayordomos. Unfortunately on Monday, it was reported those drought relief wells were vandalized and batteries stolen. It is unfortunate the drought irrigation wells developed and rehabbed several years ago, were not maintained over that time because they could be used now when needed. While it was suggested rehabbing once more, that realistically could not happen overnight for the current predicament. 2nd Lt. Governor's, idea of creating a program supported by Tribal Council to develop individual shallow ground water wells could provide a safety net for both water quality and availability for garden farmers going forward and would be easier to implement and be more cost effective than rehabilitation of the drought wells in the interim.

As of Saturday, July 16th, irrigation was back in operation. There remained concern of WQ due to mis-information that contributed to misunderstanding. To reiterate again, the westside irrigation water supplied from the Indian Canal was not affected by the SSO. Only the eastside (Chical and Ranchitos) and Los Charcos river water supply was affected by the SSO and effects were attempted to be limited based on WQ information and understanding of river hydrologic Unfortunately, those efforts dynamics. were compounded with diminishing river water supply that affected the both ability to dilute and delay the SSO plug passing through Isleta quicker.

Escherichia coli or E. coli, in the river water as the safety indicator.

Isleta's WQS for E. coli, is based on our Primary Contact use, which is 88 colonies/100 mL (milliliters), which is measured as most probable number (MPN) or colony forming units (CFU) per mL, depending on the analytical method. Both are equivalent values, but Isleta uses MPN. We do not have a standard for "Agriculture water supply use" which includes water for livestock.

NM WQS for E. coli in the Rio Grande Basin vary and range from 235 to 940 colonies/100 mL for different bodies of water, locations, and use protection. For the stretch of the Rio Grande from the headwaters of Elephant Butte upstream to Alameda bridge (Corrales bridge) that excludes Isleta, NM Primary Contact WQS recognizes 410 colonies/100 mL. Primary Contact for both Isleta and NM recognizes prolonged contact, such as swimming that involve considerable risk of ingesting water in quantities to pose a health hazard.

Researching for a WQS for agriculture surface irrigation water found that 235 colonies/100 mL was an suggested WQS for leafy crops was. "Leafy crops" can be defined as plants grown for their edible leave, which include spinach, turnip, parsley, and lettuce. However, the distinction between leafy and non-leafy crops is not always clear. The lowest WQS NM recognizes for E. coli is 235 colonies/100 mL, but is not directly tied to an agriculture irrigation use.

The Food Currently, and Drug Administration (FDA) identified 410colonies/100 mL for a single sample limit as a statistical threshold value (STV) and 126 colonies/100 mL as a geometric mean (GM) or central tendency, is recognized (21CFR112.44) for covered produce (21CFR112.1) excluding sprouts.

As of the writing concerning the SSO, WQ sampling results reported at colonies/100 mL - MPN, for the river on July 21 were:

- At 12pm, and I25 Bridge, 69.4 (reported by ABCWUA)

- At 8:49am, and river across Isleta Lakes, 213 (reported by POI

travel time it would take the tail end of sewage plug to move past, it was initially decided to re-start diverting water Wednesday morning, July 13, 2022. Alfalfa and other forage crops could be irrigated, but gardens were kept on hold. Upon making this decision, the Mayordomos were notified. With feedback received from some Mayordomos concern of water quality (WQ) safety, 2nd Lt. Governor Sanchez reevaluated travel time. His re-evaluation of travel time based on river flow at the time would take longer than the initial understanding, so re-starting diversion was delayed another day.

Due to the initial decision to re-start on the Wednesday, the Peralta holding pool was refilled, and the water was sent down the Peralta Main Canal. That afternoon, While no one can assure the safety of river water, we can only use the available water quality standards (WQS) of Isleta and New Mexico (NM) as guidelines and WQ data to assess conditions. To note, NM WQS are based on one (1) person in 100,000, cancer risk. Isleta WQS are more strict because ours are based on one (1) person in 1,000,000, cancer risk. While there are other pollutant considerations in untreated sewage influent, as a measure of safety due to the SSO, we were looking at the bacteria Environment)

- At 8:10am, and IDD (westside), 332 (reported by POI Environment)

- At 8:15am, and IDD (eastside), 279 (reported by POI Environment)

- At 8:03am, Peralta Main (below pool). 266 (reported by POI Environment)

While reiterated previously and again now, the SSO did not mix with the westside river supply for the Indian Canal/Acequia Madre. However, WQ samples taken by POI Environment at the request of the Mayordomo. Results were:

- July 11, not collected
- July 12, at 12:13pm, 42.6

- July 13, at 10:22am, 275 (It was noted a storm cell in the South Valley the evening of July 12)

- July 14, at 9:48am, 292
- July 15, at 10:37am, 323
- July 16-17, not collected due laboratory closed
- July 18, at 10:20am, 305
- July 21, at 8:30am, 266

While for the most part, the July 21 WQ data, showed irrigation water is below the FDA. 410 colonies/100mL single sample limit. However, this doesn't reflect what the GM or central tendency (average) is. It was noted a storm cell on July 12, could have influenced the next day, E. coli levels from storm water flow into connected the MRGCD conveyance system that feeds the Indian Canal/Acequia Madre. The rise in level and being maintained cannot be explained at this time. POI Environment is planning to sample above and Isleta and the Indian Canal/Acequia Madre sample location (just below the heading of the Acequia Madre west branch), to evaluate E. coli levels. POI Environment is looking to coordinate sampling with the NM Environment Department Water Quality Bureau. That sampling information will be provide in future reporting as well as what our E. coli GM is found to be.

To put into perspective, Isleta's WQS are based on a one (1) person per 1,000,000 cancer risk for surface waters within the exterior boundaries of the Pueblo. Outside our boundaries and north of us to Sandia Pueblo, NM has a lower WQS based on one (1) person per 100,000. While Isleta's surface WQS, have provided protection for our uses, the reality of population of 700,000 or greater, comprising urban, suburban, and rural area above Isleta, affects and limits the WQ we receive. We will continue to report E. coli levels and other WQ information as it becomes available.

#### **Irrigation Water Supply Update**

We are anticipating going into Prior and Paramount (P&P) water supply and operations unless we receive rainfall to keep us out. The six Middle Rio Grande Pueblos have 20,000 acre feet of water stored at Abiquiu Reservoir as previously reported. Should and when river flow and gets below P&P supply, that stored water will be released to make up the difference. We will report on P&P supply status as it changes.

#### **Strategic Water Planning**

Lastly, we will continue to do what we can to protect our water resources and related assets with the laws available to us. To assist with that effort, the Water Work Group that Tribal Council established is in the process of developing Isleta's long range Strategic Water Plan for our water resources protection, management, development, and quantification of our water rights. While we should have already had this plan in place as well as other strategic plans to guide us, it is our hope that Tribal Council will also support this effort as a necessary means. That Strategic Plan will guide our community into the future where successive Tribal Administrations and Councils will be tasked with the responsibility to implement those strategies to not only protect, management, develop, but eventually quantify our water rights for future generation.



## **Health Beat: Sun Safety Month**

August is National Sun Safety Month! This Health Observance is a reminder to keep yourself safe and healthy under the sun during the summer. It is important to get sunlight in order for your body to produce Vitamin D, but too much sun can be harmful to your skin and eyes. Summer often means fun days under the sun at graduation parties, barbeques, swimming pools or other outdoor activities. It is important to practice heat and sun safety to reduce risk of heat stress or skin damage from the sun. Here are some key tips to remember.

#### **Be Sun Smart**



 $\checkmark$  Wear protective items such sunglasses and a hat to minimize exposure to the sun.

✓ Use sunscreen with a minimum of SPF 15 and reapply every couple of hours, especially when swimming (even if it's waterproof). Apply at least 30 minutes prior to any activity in the sun to allow absorption of the product. Check the expiration date; after two years, it's time to replace it.


 $\checkmark\,$  Stay in the shade or use an umbrella to shield yourself from the sun.

#### **Beat the Heat**

- ✓ If possible, stay indoors between 10am 4pm. The sun is at its highest and hottest point during these hours.
- Avoid areas with a lot of gravel and concrete as they tend to be hotter than greener areas.
- ✓ Stay hydrated! Extra fluids are needed during hot weather.
- NEVER leave children, pets, or the elderly in a car, no matter how brief. Temperatures within a car can rise 30 to 40 degrees within minutes on a 90 degree day, even with the windows down.
- ✓ If you are concerned about an individual left in a car in Isleta, notify the Police Department at 505-869-3030.

#### **Risks and Warnings**

- ✓ Overexposure to heat and sun can cause immediate or future problems.
- ✓ Heat "illnesses", like heat exhaustion or stroke, can become serious very quickly.
- ✓ Warning signs include: heavy sweating, weakness, dizziness, dehydration, or muscle cramps. If body temperature rises over 104 degrees, call 911 immediately.
- ✓ Everyone can develop sun burn, regardless of skin tone. Treat sun burned skin with a cool cloth, soothing lotions or aloe vera.
- ✓ Constant exposure to the sun's ultraviolet (UV) rays increases the aging process, risk of skin cancer, and skin discoloration.
- ✓ Regularly self-examine skin for unusual moles or suspicious markings, as they could be a sign of skin cancer. If needed, schedule an appointment at the Isleta Health Center, 505-869-3200.

Submitters of classified ads are responsible for generating their own ads as this is a FREE service.

As a reminder, Tribal business owners may submit a small flyer at no charge. Like the classified ads, business owners are responsible for generating their own flyers as this is a FREE service.

Classified ads and business flyers will be posted no more than two consecutive months. In the event where the Newsletter may exceed the 24-page limit, classified ads and business flyers will be "bumped" for newsletter articles. Again, this is a FREE service for Tribal members.

## ISLETA PUEBLO VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Pueblo of Isleta Volunteer Fire Department will be highlighting all its members in the upcoming newsletters. Today we would like to highlight Fire Chief Lester Gary. Chief Gary is an IFSAC Firefighter II and a State of NM certified Paramedic. He brings to the Pueblo over 44 years experience in firefighting and EMS. Department's Chief Gary has worked with include Hudson Colorado Volunteer Fire Department, Bernalillo County Fire Department, New Mexico State Firefighters Training Academy, Albuquerque Police



Department Training Academy, Estancia Volunteer Fire Department and Torrance County Fire Department. Chief Gary began his career while in high school as a member of Explorer Post 432 and specialized in Search and Rescue. Chief Gary is married, has three grown children and five grandchildren. When he became Fire Chief in 2020, the department had five members, to date the department has grown to 13 members with five certified firefighters, and three certified Emergency Medical Technicians. We have increased our fire apparatus from four to seven with two Command Vehicles. His goal for the department is to reach 20 members with nine paid staff. This would allow the department to have 24-hour coverage 7 days a week with the augmentation of the Volunteers. The department has established several outreach programs for the community to include a more personalized assistance to agricultural burns, working with POI departments to establish Emergency Operation Plans, a home safety survey, fire extinguisher training and working with the Schools and Library on their fire drills. The department participated last year in the New Mexico State Fair Parade and received a first place award, Fire fighter day at the State Fair and were the featured Fire department for the 911 Memorial Service and have been asked back again this year. Several members have begun their firefighter certification classes. Chief Gary has stated he has enjoyed every day he comes to work and looks forward to creating within the Pueblo a Fire Wise Community/Department. As you can see, there has been quite the growth in our department and hope this trend continues for many years to come. Thank you for all the community support we have been receiving and hope we can give back a much-needed service.







# ANIMAL CONTROL

#### Hello everyone and happy summer!

We hope everyone is staying cool during these VERY HOT summer months. If you do not know already, the State of New Mexico is in a bad drought and we are seeing record high temperatures all over the state. That being said it is important to make sure your four-legged friends are staying cool as well. If you are not familiar with the Isleta Animal Ordinance, there are rules for making sure your pets are in a safe living environment, whether you keep them inside or outside. If you are to keep your pets outside, they **MUST** be confined to your property at all times. If you have a fenced in yard which is able to prevent your pets from escaping that is fine. If you do not, your pets must be on a restraint line which is a minimum of 8 (eight) feet long and must be fixated to the animal by use of a properly fitted collar and harness. Your pets must also have fresh water easily accessible and shelter available to escape from the harsh elements. Failure to comply will result in the proper actions being taken and possible forfeiture of the animal(s).

One other big thing Animal Control has noticed while out on patrol is the fact that the majority of the animals we pick up do <u>NOT</u> have proper identification. Proper ID is either an ID tag on the pet's collar or a Microchip. Under Ordinance this is **REQUIRED** to have at all times. An ID tag shall include the owner's name, physical address, contact phone number and the animal's name. A microchip shall have all these factors as well. If your pet does not have any proper ID and it is picked up by Animal Control, it will be considered a stray and transported to the Valencia County Animal Shelter, where they have their own intake and holding fees.

To finish, I would like to let everyone know of Isleta Animal Control's new holding facility! We are currently working to put permanent kennels throughout the building to reduce the number of animals taken to the Valencia County Animal Shelter. It is located off of Tribal Road 64 in Pickle Heights, right next to the little rec. IAC is currently taking donations on blankets, towels, and toys for the cats and dogs we hold here. We also have some food leftover to be donated for free to Tribal Members. Please call to arrange a time to meet and get food. Limited stock is available.

Section 3.B Proper Identification. All animals must have proper identification tags attached to their collars or embedded in a microchip at all times. The tag shall include the owner's name, physical address, phone number and the animal's name. If an untagged animal is picked up by Animal Control, it will be considered a stray and transported to the Animal Shelter. Failure to comply with this subsection will result in a \$25.00 fine made payable to Animal Control.

Section 3.E Proper Care and Maintenance. It is the responsibility of the owner to provide adequate shelter, fresh food and water for their animals at all times and a clean living environment. Clean water must be available and accessible at all times. Owners are also responsible to provide adequate veterinary care for an injured or sick animal. Depending on the severity or condition of the animal, it could lead to CRIMINAL CHARGES being filed for ANIMAL NEGLECT and or ANIMAL CRUELTY under this Animal Ordinance.

Section 3.F Running at Large. No animal is allowed to run at large, roam or create a nuisance on another person's property or public areas of the Pueblo. All animals must be within the control of their owner, confined or physically restrained in a manner it cannot escape. First offense for an animal running at large will result in a \$25.00 fine. Second offense will result in a \$50.00 fine. The third offense will result in a \$100.00 fine. Four or more violations will result in being cited for *"Nuisance Animals"* as well as a petition will be filed in court to have the animal removed from its owner.

# August 2022 DCHP/YACC Newsletter

Ma K'u Wam from the Department of Cultural & Historic Preservation and Yonan An Cultural Center! We've been staying very busy this past month planning a very special event...

As you may or may not know, August 3rd is considered an important date in Isleta Pueblo history; it is Miguel Trujillo Day! "Who is Miguel Trujillo?" you may be wondering. Miguel Trujillo is considered one of the great civil rights pioneers of New Mexico. He was a well-respected veteran serving in World War II, an advocate for higher education and the Indigenous right to vote. On August 2nd, 1948 Trujillo sued the Valencia County Clerk Eloy Garley in the case known as Trujillo v. Garley. The civil case (Civil No. 1353) was heard at the Federal District Court in Santa Fe. Miguel argued that although he did not pay state tax (because he resided on the Pueblo reservation) he did pay other forms of tax (e.g. gasoline, sales, and federal income taxes), therein entitled him to voting rights. The court ruled in favor of Trujillo on August 11th, 1948, and their verdict changed the State of New Mexico Constitution by removing constitutional provisions that prohibited Indigenous people from practicing their right to vote

It's been 74 years since the Trujillo v. Garley case, and since then Native Americans have won seats in the Legislature and Congress, and beyond that Trujillo has given the Indigenous people the power to voice their opinions at the ballot box. And this year we want to recognize and celebrate Miguel Trujillo's efforts.

#### WANTED: TRIBAL MEMBERS WHO MAY HAVE AN INTEREST IN BECOMING A TEACHER

On July 20, 2018 Judge Sarah Singleton issued a decision and order on the Yazzie/ Martinez v. State of New Mexico. The Court found that the State violated New Mexico's Indian Education Act and Native students' right to an adequate education. One of the remedies is to increase the number of Native American teachers who can relate to and serve Native American students. We need tribal members to take an active role in our students education. If you have ever pondered the idea of becoming a teacher please reach out to our Department. We want to support you and we want to support overall student and community success.

#### K-12 Updates:

The Department of Education wants to ensure all students are successful in the upcoming 2022-2023 school year. If you are a Tribal member attending a K-12 school or if you are a Native American Student attending a Los Lunas Public school, you are eligible to receive supplies. Our school supply distribution was held July 27-29, if you missed it please call our office to arrange a time for pick-up.

In addition, the Tribal Council recently approved funds to support bridging learning gaps that have been caused by the disruption of education due to COVID-19. Funds can be used for independent tutoring support, such as: Varsity Tutors, Sylvan Learning, Tutor Doctor, Huntington Learning to

name a few. If you are in need of tutoring services please contact our office.

#### **The Education Assistance Fund:**

• The Educational Assistance fund was established and approved by the Tribal Council and the Board of Education to assist families in meeting their student's educational needs. The Pueblo of Isleta recognizes the need to provide families with supplemental funding to assist their child/children in their education. Education Assistance may be provided for the following:

- Students K-12: Students with disabilities.
- Students K-12: Students attending private institutions.
- Students K-12: Students involved in extra-curricular activities, i.e., band, chess, sports activities, science fair, etc.

Back to school time!

Hope you and your families had a wonderful summer. It's that time again for back to school. We look forward to a new year and hope you enjoy the 2022-2023 school year as well. As we all know Covid-19 is still around; please remember to stay safe - wear your face mask and make sure to always use hand sanitizer. Going back to school can be difficult for some kids during this time and they may begin to show signs of anxiety such as:

- Complaints of headaches/stomachaches
- Get angry more easily
- Changes in eating and sleeping patterns
- May be more attached to parents more than usual

There are many issues such as

• Bullying- they might be worried or scared that they might be bullied for a number of things like their choice of clothing or their physical appearance such weight loss/gain, acne, etc.

• Their choice of friends- worried if they will make friends or if they will continue to have the same friends.

• Sports-if they will make a certain team for the first time or continue to be a part of the same team.

• Classes- if they will be able to keep up with their assignments, or get into any AP classes that they have been working towards, or even if they will move up in their grade classification.

Know that it is important to talk to your child (ren) as much as possible about any issues that may be affecting them, as often as possible and make sure to listen to and to talk to them without any criticism or judgement so that they will know they are supported. When this happens, they will trust you and will be able to come to you if they have any problems and will feel safe talking to you.

If you feel that your child is experiencing fear of going back to school or any signs of anxiety, please feel free to contact our office and we can assist you in contacting Beeh-Kooee (Isleta Behavioral Health Services) or you may contact them directly at 505-869-5475.

The Truancy Department has been working with the different school districts and schools our students attend, throughout the summer. The lines of communication have been strengthened and we look forward to working with our Isleta students and school administrators to strengthen the services provided to them. # Pueblo of Isleta Veterans Association -DD 214 Discharge Documents

A DD 214 is a document issued when a service member performs active duty or at least 90 consecutive days of active duty training. The document contains information normally needed to verify military service benefits, retirement, employment, and membership in veterans' organizations. Application for US funeral flags and military headstones, by next-of-kin.

A veteran, or next of kin, may apply for a DD 214 replacement. Requests to get a copy of DD 214 from discharges less than 62 years ago must be signed and dated by the veteran or next-of-kin by completing VA Form 180. VA Form 180 can be downloaded by going to va.gov. If you are next-of-kin of a deceased veteran, you must provide proof of death of the veteran such as a copy of a death certificate, letter from a funeral home, or published obituary.

The request for a DD 214 must include, if available, the veterans' full name, social security number, place of birth, branch of service, dates of military service, place of discharge, place of entry into service, last unit assigned, and any information that may be pertinent to veterans time of military service. Approximate time to receive a copy of a DD 214 upon request may be at least three months.

In 1973, there was a fire at the National Personnel Records Center in St. Louis where military records are stored. If you were in the Army before 1960, there is a 20% chance that your records were destroyed. If you were in the Air Force before 1964 and your name comes after Hubbard, James E., there is a 75% chance that your records were destroyed.

The reason for this article is because, recently, the Pueblo of Isleta Veterans' Association has had an increase of requests from veterans for DD 214 replacements, and family members, who cannot find DD 214 Discharge Documents. If you are a veteran, or next-of-kin, in search of a DD 214, you may call POIVA veterans service officer at 505-264-4110 for assistance.

The Isleta Animal Control Division was busy last month and Erika Pasqual, Animal Control Officer, updates us on their activity held in July:



In July, Isleta Animal Control hosted a three day spay and neuter clinic with Rocky Mountain Puppy Rescue for the pets of Isleta tribal members and the employees of Isleta Pueblo. Included were pets from Valencia County Animal Shelter and Bosque Farms. During those three days a total of 170 animals were altered. By spaying and neutering your animal it helps keep down the over population of canines and felines around the Pueblo and the surrounding area. It also helps the shelter with unnecessary euthanasias due to overcrowding. By spaying and neutering your pets, it also helps an animal's health by decreasing pyometras, cancers and unwanted litters. Rocky Mountain Puppy Rescue has worked with the Pueblo of Isleta for several years on providing low cost spay and neuter services for our members. We would like to encourage tribal members to take advantage of their services in the coming future. Isleta Animal Control would like to thank Rocky Mountain Puppy Rescue, the Veterinary Doctors, veterinary technicians, and all volunteers who came out to make this possible.

Isleta Animal Control and Police Cadets Montoya and Tafoya helped with the July 4th festivities at the Elderly center at the beginning of July. Their volunteering efforts helped with the set up and take down of decorations, serving beverages, along with the lunch meals. There were also games and a DJ for the Elders' entertainment. Our Elders are the importance of keeping culture and tradition ongoing, enabling our future generations to learn and prosper. #### SAFETY TIPS:

In the last newsletter we focused on heat emergencies but again remind everyone about the dangers of the extreme heat we experienced in July and will continue this month. Please make sure you stay hydrated and check on the elderly as they may not take in a sufficient amount of liquid, especially water. Children need to stay hydrated as well and everyone needs to use sunscreen or wear long sleeve tops to protect the skin when outdoors.

As we all know New Mexico has been experiencing the Monsoon Season. Information released by the National Weather Service is found below:



New Mexico and other areas across the Southwest U.S. are affected by the North American Monsoon System (NAMS) every summer, and the "Monsoon Season" is designated as the period lasting from June 15th through September 30th. With the onset of the Monsoon, New Mexico is typically impacted by a variety of weather hazards that can often put the population at risk for serious injury or death. Thunderstorm frequency increases during this period, while exceptionally hot days are common as well.

Despite the desert environment of the Land of Enchantment, statistics indicate that significant weather events associated with the Monsoon are responsible for property damage, injuries and fatalities across the state every single year.

As a result, we urge all residents and visitors to become familiar with the hazards associated with the Summer Monsoon. Please take the time to review safety rules that could save your life or help prevent serious injury. Community governments and businesses should review their emergency action preparedness plans and are urged to conduct drills to train staff and employees in flash flood procedures. The best way to avoid lightning, flash floods, and other dangerous weather events during the monsoon season is by staying alert weather conditions  $_{\mathrm{the}}$ of and avoiding the threat before it occurs.

- Monitoring current weather forecasts on TV or the internet.
- Listening to weather reports on the
- radio or a NOAA weather radio.Subscribing to lightning and severe
- Subscribing to lightning and severe weather notification services.
- Scanning the skies 360 degrees around and overhead before leaving a safe location.

# Understanding Watches, Warnings, and Advisories:


Watches (Severe Thunderstorm, Flash Flood, and Tornado, for example) mean that widespread severe weather or flash flooding is possible. A watch means that severe weather or flash flooding has not yet occurred, but weather conditions are becoming highly volatile. Pay close attention to the weather, and tune into TV, radio, or NOAA Weather Radio broadcasts regularly.

Warnings (Severe Thunderstorm, Flash Flood, Tornado, Dust Storm, Excessive Heat) mean that life-threatening weather is about to occur, or has been reported. Take action immediately.

Areal Flood Advisories mean heavy rains will cause minor flooding of washes, streams, and typical flood-prone areas. Flooding in this situation is usually not serious. If the flooding does become life threatening, then the flood advisory is upgraded to a Flood Warning.

Warnings are not issued for lightning,

News media and New Mexico emergency managers or anyone needing information on Monsoon Season significant weather, or any other preparedness and planning, are invited to contact one of the following offices for details:




mainly because thunderstorms, no matter how weak, can produce deadly cloud-toground lightning. Any time thunderstorms are in the area, lightning is a serious threat. This is supported by the fact lightning is the number one killer in New Mexico, with 84 deaths since 1959.

Most of the statistics depicted on the Monsoon Awareness Week web pages were obtained using the publication Storm Data and Unusual Weather Phenomena, which contains chronological listings, by state, of hurricanes, tornadoes, thunderstorms, hail, floods, drought conditions, lightning, high winds, snow, temperature extremes and other weather phenomena. The reports are provided by the National Weather Service and contain statistics on personal injuries and damage estimates. Storm Data is a publication of the National Climatic Data Center.

Additionally, we all know the State of New Mexico has multiple serious fires and the threats of flooding in the burn scar areas are significant. If traveling near these areas be aware of weather changes and the dangers of flash floods. Stay out of arroyos and do not cross roadways if there is running water across it as you cannot determine the depth or damage sustained.


# **ISLETA PARKS & RECREATION**




Here are some highlights of summer activities: Children were introduced to 3D pens in Explora class and they traced pictures, peeled the melted form with





# **KEEP YOUR CHILDREN SAFE**

Contact the Isleta Health Center Health Educator at 869-4479 to have your Child Safety Seat checked to make sure it is properly installed and appropriate for your child




A rear-facing car seat provides the best protection for young children. When properly harnessed, the seat will cradle the child to reduce the stress to the child's fragile neck and spinal cord.

A forward-facing car seat has a harness and tether that limits your child's forward movement during a crash. Keep your child in a harness car seat as long as possible, to the weight or height limit allowed by the manufacturer.

A booster seat positions the seat belt so that it fits properly over the stronger parts of your child's body: Hips, Chest, Shoulders.

Proper seat belt fits when: • Lap belt lies snugly across upper thighs, not touching the stomach. • The shoulder belt lies snug across the shoulder and chest, not across the face or neck. \*Children under 13 years should sit in the rear seat.
