I want to continue to wish the entire community a nice safe and healthy month as we approach into May! This month is going to be busy as everyone is preparing for the farming season, weddings, graduation, and the end of the school year! We would like to remind the community to continue to practice the safety protocols and continuing to keep our COVID numbers low.

My apologies, to the community for canceling our Community Meeting on such short notice. We have rescheduled the Community Meeting for Saturday, May 13, 2023. The meeting will be held at the Isleta Resort and Casino in Ballroom B from 9:00am-12:00pm. We would like to see you all there to hear what changes and projects we have been working on.

We are pleased to announce that Marilyn Stephanie Zuni has joined the Department of Cultural and Historic Preservation/Pueblo of Isleta Cultural Center as Department Director. We are excited to have Stephanie joining the department as we continue our mission to preserve the culture, history, and language of the Pueblo of Isleta, and work toward our goal of opening the Cultural Center in the Summer, 2023.

The Pueblo of Isleta, Veterans Association and the Isleta Governor's office would like to invite everyone to attend the Suicide Prevention Awareness Public Meeting. This event will be hosted on Saturday, May 20, 2023 from 10:00am-12:00pm at the St. Augustine CCD Building.

Since our last newsletter, we are happy to say the Chical Well Project is still in the working progress. More updates on the Well Projects will come later from Public Works Department.

As we continue with the renovations of the little leagues fields. The Little League Chical field on Tribal Road 10 is making progress with the field lights. We ask you are careful around these areas as the facilities are undergoing these improvements.

NMDOT has scheduled repair and maintenance for NM147 starting the week of May 1, 2023 and anticipate completion by May 5, 2023. Repair and maintenance operations will be limited to daylight hours and will include an overlay of the roadway with a thin layer of asphalt pavement. Restriping will take place shortly after the paving work is completed. NMDOT will provide traffic control, which will maintain one lane traffic during the repair and maintenance operations. We ask you to be cautious during the repair and maintenance operations, your patience will be greatly appreciated.

"MPN" is a unit of measure that stands for most probable number. MPN is equivalent to colony forming units ("CFU").

The Pueblo of Isleta's most stringent surface water quality standard for E. coli bacteria is 88 MPN/100 ml at all times and at all flow rates.

By Order of the Governor, the Rio Grande is closed for fishing. The reason for closure is for the safety of our community. We have been blessed with a good spring runoff. Be aware that bacteria concentrations in the Rio Grande typically spike or rise to unsafe levels following storm events and high water levels in tributaries upstream such as the Jemez River. The wastewater treatment plant near Jemez Springs failed the week of April 10th; it is not known if the treatment plant failure affected water quality in the Rio Grande at Isleta. Please watch signage at the NM 147 bridge. Governor will lift the closure order when the Rio Grande is safe.

Moonlight Drive Extension Project. We have selected a contractor and necessary approvals to have the project under construction within the May-June 2023 timeframe. The project will involve the extension of existing Moonlight Drive to a new intersection of Moonlight Drive with NM314. This project includes two

Notes regarding surface water quality sampling:

On September 30, 2022 one sampling event was conducted to measure the concentration of pesticides and herbicides at 4 sample locations: the drain near NM 45 and Interstate 25, Atrisco Riverside Drain, NM 147 and the Albuquerque Riverside Drain near the Northern Boundary. All results were non-detect.

Irrigation waters on the west side were shut off around March 22, 2023 for flushing.

People who wish to submit an article or flyer are responsible for generating their own article or flyer. Should you need help, please call the Library at 505.869.9808 and set up a date and time to sit down with a Library staff member who will help you throughout the process. The Library will NOT accept notes dropped off at the Library or information over the phone to generate your article.

PROBATES need to be published in the Newsletter for two consecutive months. Probates are considered court documents, therefore, all submitters must provide: 1) Name of Deceased, 2) Date of Deceased 3) Court Case # and 4) Date of Court Date. A Probate form can be found on the Newsletter Archive page at http://www.isletapueblo.com/ newsletters.html.

CLASSIFIED ADS: The new administration has requested that the Newsletter start a Classified Ad section for Tribal members selling land, houses, mobile homes, vehicles, and farm equipment. Leasing of houses and mobile homes will be accepted. Smaller items which can be sold at the local flea markets or weekly yard sales will NOT be accepted.

Currently, this service is FREE to Tribal members. Land, houses, and mobile homes must be within the reservation boundaries. Ads must meet the 160 character limit. Ads that exceed the 160 characters will NOT be submitted into the Newsletter. A single picture June be submitted with the ad. Submitters of classified ads are responsible for generating their own ads as this is a FREE service.

As a reminder, Tribal business owners may submit a small flyer at no charge. Like the classified ads, business owners are responsible for generating their own flyers as this is a FREE service.

Classified ads and business flyers will be posted no more than two consecutive months. In the event where the Newsletter may exceed the 24-page limit, classified ads and business flyers will be "bumped" for newsletter articles. Again, this is a FREE service for Tribal members.

The Isleta Newsletter is owned and operated by the Pueblo of Isleta. Therefore, the Governor of the Pueblo of Isleta has the final say of all articles and contents within the Isleta Newsletter.

Scholarship Application Tips

- Meet all application deadlines

 Use a calendar or planner, make a schedule, and stick to it.
- Gather application materials early

 Give yourself plenty of time to complete each step.
- 3. Don't ignore small award

a. Small awards can add up. The larger the award, the more competition you'll face

- 4. Request letters of recommendation early
 - a. Some applications require letters of recommendation. Think carefully about who should write letters and choose people who can speak to your strengths and ability to overcome your weaknesses. Give your recommenders no less than two weeks notice so they have time to write on your behalf. Be prepared to provide them with additional information about yourself or the scholarship. Make sure to follow up with your recommender to assure that your letter was submitted.
- 5. Write a great essay

a. Think carefully about the question being asked and use this opportunity to tell the selection committee things about you that might not show elsewhere in the application. Get help with editing for grammar and spelling, but do your own writing—the committee wants to hear from you personally.

6. Try, try again

a. Keep trying even if you don't win a scholarship right away. Save copies of every application that you complete so you don't have to start from scratch every time.





Jump Start Summer School Program

This year's summer school program will focus on supporting returning students who demonstrate academic needs by building reading, writing, and mathematics skills that is enriched with art, physical education, and Tiwa activities. Teachers will use student performance data, classroom observation data, quarterly grade reports, and attendance data to recommend students for the Jump Start Summer School Program. The program will take place on July 10-21, 2023. Participation is limited to 50 students to allow for more focused academic support and enrichment. This is a full-day program from 8:00 am to 3:00 pm, Monday-Friday, with breakfast and lunch provided through the Pueblo of Isleta Public Library. Bus transportation will be provided daily. Recommendations for the Jump Start Summer School Program will be sent to families by May 5. Please respond promptly to secure your child's spot and contact your child's teacher for more information.

Enroll Now for Next Year

Enrollment for next year has begun! Pick up an Enrollment Application from the school or download a copy from our website. Re-enrollment packets for returning students will be sent home. Enrollment is filled on a first come-first serve basis with priority given to returning students.

Student Eligibility

The Code of Federal Regulation (25 CFR §39.2) has established requirements for each child who attend a BIE-funded school. The following documents are required to complete a student's enrollment each year:

- Student Enrollment Application
- A copy of State Birth Certificate or other guardianship documentation
- A copy of Certificate of Indian Blood (CIB) or Tribal Enrollment
- Physical Exam and Immunization Records
- Release/Transfer of records from last school attended

Age Limit

A student must be 5 years old before September 1 of the school year to begin Kindergarten, according to the New Mexico Statute 22-13-3.

There was a total of approximately 14,000-lbs of debris that was found. Among the debris found was a 500-lb bomb and a 1,000-lb bomb.

Health Beat: Mental Health Awareness 2023

While we go through the motions of our fast-paced lives, it can be easy to overlook all aspects of our health. It is important to keep up physical healthy habits like daily exercise and eating healthy foods. But we need to remember that our mental health plays a very important role in our wellbeing day to day. May is a month that is dedicated to mental health awareness and all the benefits that come with practicing healthy habits to keep our minds positive and productive. Fostering a healthy positive mindset can be very beneficial with our self-esteem, confidence, and outlook on life. This can be easier said than done majority of the time.

Mental and physical health are equal components to our overall health and can determine how we interact with any situation we find ourselves facing. When we find our day consumed by high stress problems it is important to find and practice healthy coping mechanisms to help yourself relax and unwind. An example of healthy coping can be getting exercise, going for walks, talking to friends or family. The options are not limited! Finding a healthy coping style or activity can look different for everyone and can include a combination of things that help us feel good. It is also important to remember that our mental health does not stay the same over time. Many factors contribute to our state of mental wellbeing but if we are able to find and continually practice healthy coping methods we have the ability to step back and assess our problems with a new perspective.

Many factors can contribute to our risk of mental illness and there is never one sole cause. For many, mental illness can be remnants of early adverse life experiences (child abuse, sexual abuse, witnessing violence, etc.), major medical conditions (Cancer, Diabetes, etc), chemical imbalances in the brain, use of alcohol or drugs, and/or having feeling of loneliness or isolation. Typically, mental health problems are clinically diagnosable and are products of our experiences, biology, psychology and social factors. There are many various types of treatments for mental health problems and are dependent on the individual. Treatments can include therapies (talk, trauma, etc), medication, or both depending on the individual's needs that will target specific mental health problems.

Mental health issues are common, help is available. People with mental health issues can improve and many recover completely. So, if you or someone you know is struggling with mental health, feel free to reach out to the B'eeh-K'oo-ee Wellness Center at 505-869-5475 and set up an appointment with one of our counselors.





Pueblo of Isleta Elder Center Efforts to Help our Elders with Loneliness

We are providing our elders with important data regarding the impacts of isolation and loneliness. Following the article below, please read about the efforts put forth by the POI Elder Center to combat Isolation and Loneliness.



Loneliness and Social Isolation Linked to Serious Health Conditions

Although it's hard to measure social isolation and loneliness precisely, there is strong evidence that many adults aged 50 and older are socially isolated or lonely in ways that put their health at risk. Recent studies found that:

• Social isolation significantly increased a person's risk of premature death from all causes, a risk that may rival those of smoking, obesity, and physical inactivity.

Social isolation was associated with about a 50% increased risk of dementia.
Poor social relationships (characterized by social isolation or loneliness) was associated with a 29% increased risk of heart disease and a 32% increased risk of stroke.

What a great way to stay healthy, socialize and engage with members of the community and staff.

Social isolation was associated with about a 50% increased risk of dementia and other serious medical conditions. Loneliness and social isolation in older adults are serious public health risks affecting a significant number of people in the United States and putting them at risk for dementia and other serious medical conditions.

A report from the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine (NASEM) points out that more than onethird of adults aged 45 and older feel lonely, and nearly one-fourth of adults aged 65 and older are considered to be socially isolated. Older adults are at increased risk for loneliness and social isolation because they are more likely to face factors such as living alone, the loss of family or friends, higher rates of depression, anxiety, and suicide.

• Loneliness among heart failure patients was associated with a nearly 4 times increased risk of death, 68% increased risk of hospitalization, and 57% increased risk of emergency department visits.

What Can You Do If You Are Experiencing Loneliness?

The POI Elder Center is a great place to start exploring resources for seniors, right here in your own backyard!!

Daily Congregate Meals: come join your friends and/or relatives for lunch M-F 12-1pm. The menu is posted in the monthly Tribal Newsletter and an added Sr. Olympics: Another way to stay fit, connect with friends and relatives by participating. Many events are offered throughout the year, such as: *Practice Dates* to learn a sport/event or hone your skills in your area of sport interest: *Local Games and/or All Indian Game Day*compete with other tribal communities; *State Games* compete with Seniors across the State of NM; and when you are at the top of your game represent the POI at the *National Games*.

You may qualify for a discount if you live on Tribal lands* **AND** can provide proof for any **ONE** of the following:

- Your income is at or below 135% of the federal poverty guidelines, **OR**
- You participate in any **ONE** of these government benefit programs:

 - Medicaid
 - Federal Public Housing Assistance (FPHA)
 - Veterans Pension and Survivors Benefit
 - Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
 - Bureau of Indian Affairs General Assistance
 - Tribal Head Start (income based)Tribal Temporary Assistance for
 - Needy Families (Tribal TANF)


WHAT IS A HOUSEHOLD?

You can have multiple households at

- Four adult family members that live at the same address, but do not share income and expenses, may each have their own Lifeline benefit.

You may need to show proof that you qualify for Lifeline, such as:

• A copy of your SNAP or program letter OR

• A copy of your pay stub or tax return to prove your income is at or below 135% of the federal poverty guidelines.

TIPS FOR APPLICANTS ON TRIBAL LANDS

- Check the "Tribal Lands" Box.
- Provide a Tribal ID Number if a SSN is unavailable.
- Your Lifeline company can help determine whether your address is on Tribal lands.
- Ask your service provider about *Tribal Link-Up*. You may be able to get up to \$100 toward your connection to home service.

NOTE: An applicant living at a residence without an identifiable address will be asked to provide Geo-coordinates for the physical location. If you don't have this information, you can provide USAC a map that identifies the location of the residence, landmarks, and distances.

HOW TO KEEP YOUR BENEFIT

USE IT OR LOSE IT

If your mobile phone or Internet is free, use it at least **once every 30 days** to keep the benefit.

RECERTIFICATION

Each year, Lifeline will conduct a check to ensure you still qualify for the benefit. We will review databases that can verify your participation in qualifying programs.

We will send you a letter asking you to recertify your benefit ONLY if we are unable to confirm you are still eligible.






