Tribal Administration would like to congratulate all the hunters who were drawn for the 2025 Traditional Hunts.


November has been a busy month for us all, we would like to first, "Thank All our Veterans for their service to our country".



- What is the issue?
- Location (Complete Address)
- · Contact Name & Number
- · Attached pictures, if any

NOTE: Please one work order per submittal! Our new system will not generate multiple work orders in one submission.

Not providing all detail information on your work order may cause a delay!

We understand that not everyone has access to a smart device or computer to submit a work order, calling into Public Works Office at 505-869-5170 is still available.

LETTER FROM THE EDITOR

DEADLINE for January Newsletter articles is set for Tuesday, December 09, 2025, at 4:30 pm. Articles may be dropped off at the Library or emailed to Nathaniel.Lujan@ isletapueblo.com. Should you email your article, expect a confirmation email. If you do not receive a confirmation email, odds are it never made it to me and then it's time to panic, so call Nate at 505.869.9808.

People who wish to submit an article or flyer are responsible for generating their own article or flyer. Should you need help, please call the Library at 505.869.9808 and set up a date and time to sit down with a Library staff member who will help you throughout the process. The Library will NOT accept notes dropped off at the Library or information over the phone to generate your article.

PROBATES need to be published in the Newsletter for two consecutive months. Probates are considered court documents, therefore, all submitters must provide: 1) Name of Deceased, 2) Date of Deceased 3) Court Case #, and 4) Date of Court Date. A Probate form can be found on the Newsletter Archive page at http://www.isletapueblo.com/newsletters.html.

CLASSIFIED ADS: The new administration has requested that the Newsletter start a Classified Ad section for Tribal members selling land, houses, mobile homes, vehicles, and farm equipment. Leasing of houses and mobile homes will be accepted. Smaller items that can be sold at the local flea markets or weekly yard sales will NOT be accepted.

Currently, this service is FREE to Tribal members. Land, houses, and mobile homes must be within the reservation boundaries. Ads must meet the 160-character limit. Ads that exceed the 160-characters will NOT be submitted to the Newsletter. A single picture may be submitted with the ad. Submitters of classified ads are responsible for generating their ads as this is a FREE service.

As a reminder, Tribal business owners may submit a small flyer at no charge. Like the classified ads, business owners are responsible for generating their flyers as this is a FREE service.

Classified ads and business flyers will be posted no more than two consecutive months. In the event that the Newsletter may exceed the 24-page limit, classified ads and business flyers will be "bumped" for newsletter articles. Again, this is a FREE service for Tribal members.

The Isleta Newsletter is owned and operated by the Pueblo of Isleta. Therefore, the Governor of the Pueblo of Isleta has the final say in all articles and contents within the Isleta Newsletter.



There was a total of 9 students who received perfect attendance. Does your student have perfect attendance? If so, they are eligible to receive an incentive from our department. You will need to fill out a Release of Information form so we can contact the school and confirm your student's attendance. Contact our department no later than December 12th so that your students' attendance can be confirmed through their school; your student may then be eligible to receive an incentive. A gentle reminder that perfect attendance means zero absences, zero tardies and zero early check-outs.

Soon, all the students will be on Christmas vacation and that will be their time to relax and enjoy their free time. Once January rolls around, the time spent in school will fly by and before you know it, some of the students will be graduating! We would like to remind students to attend school daily and be on time so that this does not affect your attendance and the learning time for each class.

Mountain Center Trip:



School Visits:





TIME TO PREPARE FOR THE COLD

Colder temperatures are here and it's time to protectyour plumbing from freezing temperatures. Sewer piping can freeze – especially underneath a modular home. Take time now to check your water and sewer lines. Any exposed water or sewer pipe should be protected with heat tape, insulation or other means to help prevent the pipes from freezing. If you have a modular home, please ensure the skirting is in good condition and if there is no skirting, do what you can to protect the underside of the home from the cold.

Swamp coolers should be properly winterized. The water supply line should be removed from the spigot or frost free and drained. Frost frees should not be left in the open position; remove any hoses from the frost free and close the frost free. When left open, the frost free cannot drain the water that is inside the unit. The frost free is designed to drain itself when the handle is put in the closed position, which should help prevent

Homeowners should know where the main water shut off is to their residence. Most homes have an interior and exterior main shut off valve. Toilets and sinks should have isolation valves going directly to the fixture. The purpose of the fixture isolation valves is to isolate just the fixture that has a leak, allowing water to be available at the other fixtures in the home. Have you ever tested these isolation valves to ensure they work? Take time before cold weather moves in to locate these valves and ensure they are working properly.

There should be a main isolation valve located both inside and outside of the home. Many of the interior main shut-off valves are located close to the hot water heater. Shutting this valve down will stop water from entering the home but you will still have water available outside the home. If it is necessary to shut off the water outside the home, knowing exactly where your shut-off valve is, is vital.

Locating the exterior isolation valve may be challenging. Take time to locate your exterior shut-off while it is not an emergency. Placing a marker of some type near the shut-off will save time in the event you do have an emergency and need the main water to the home shut-off. It will take Public Works time to respond to an emergency water leak, especially after hours or on weekends. If you know where the main shutoff valve is, Public Works employees can arrive and work immediately on shutting off the water to the home. If they need to first locate the shutoff, valuable time is lost and water damage to the home may occur.

Be prepared and protect your water and sewer pipes from the cold. Check the isolation valves at each fixture and know how to turn off your water in an emergency. Locate and mark the location of your exterior water shut-off device.



IHSP TRAFFIC DIVISION

The thoroughfares through the Pueblo (I-25, Highways 47, 314, 45 & 317) are always busy, particularly with commuters going to and from work. However, with the upcoming holidays increased traffic and out-of-town/out-of-state visitors will be evident. The Traffic Division will be busier with the increased traffic and will be ramping up enforcement measures as the end goal is to ensure the roadways within the Pueblo of Isleta remain safe for all travelers. The police department will again, as in past years, participate in the National Highway Safety Administration mobilization, "Don't Shatter the Dream".

"Don't Shatter the Dream" was first launched in 2009 by the Bureau of Indian Affairs" and continues today. The campaign runs throughout Indian Country to prevent impaired driving during this holiday season and is conducted by BIA and tribal law enforcement agencies throughout the country. The mobilization runs December 10, 2025, through January 1, 2026.

As always, particularly during the holidays and increased travel, the Isleta Police Department emphasizes:

Please do not drink and drive as the consequences could be costly in many ways......attorney fees, bonds, court appearances, loss of driving privileges and possible jail time. Ask yourself, "Is it worth taking the chance to drive when impaired? Don't operate under the false premise(s) "I can drive just fine" or "They won't catch me".....stay home, find a designated driver, or take an Uber. Keep in mind "Buzzed Driving is Drunk Driving".

Officer C-Jay Smith with the Isleta Pueblo Police Department Traffic Division was selected to attend the 33rd Class of the New Mexico Drug Recognition Expert (DRE) Program. DRE School is a training within the Law Enforcement Community that is known to be rigorous and demanding. The DRE Program in New Mexico is built on a foundation of professionalism, integrity, and support and is comprised of a diverse cross-section of law enforcement professionals from across the state,

including municipal, county, tribal, and state agencies.

An Officer entering the DRE program must be proficient in their DWI/Standard Field Sobriety Skills and must attend the Advanced Roadside Impairment Driving Enforcement (ARIDE) prior to submitting their application to DRE school. Once an officer is selected, they are trained in recognizing specific symptoms and behaviors that are caused by drugs.

The officers must attend a three-phase training process:

DRE Pre-School (16+ hours)

DRE School (56+ hours)

DRE Field Certification (40-60+ Hours).

DRE School is extremely challenging, requiring a significant amount of time, commitment, hard work, and dedication. It includes intensive classroom learning on physiology, Standarized Field Sobriety Tests (SFSTs), drug categories, wet labs, multiple written exams, and must conduct 12 successful drug influence evaluations under the supervision of a certified DRE instructor. Success requires diligent study and being able to handle stress as it culminates throughout the program.

The overall goal of DRE school is to train officers to identify and distinguish individuals impaired by drugs other than or in addition to alcohol. Officer Smith successfully completed the first two phases of DRE School and was named Valedictorian of his class. Officer Smith will be traveling to San Francisco to complete the final phase of DRE School. Since joining the police department, Officer Smith has contributed to the apprehension of drunk drivers in the Pueblo, and we commend his continued efforts to protect and serve the community of Isleta.

Thank you, Officer Smith, for your hard work and continued dedication, and good luck on the final phase of your training.

STATISTICS FOR IHSP TRAFFIC DIVISION

Here are some statistics for the Traffic Division for this past grant year (October 1, 2024 through September 30, 2025):

93	DWIs (apprehended/arrested)
4248	Citations issued for speed
532	Seatbelt violations
43	Carseats were distributed

Unfortunately, of the many crashes investigated, there were six (6) resulting in fatalities, and the division is dedicated to enforcement and strives to reduce this number for the coming grant year. Remember fatal crashes can be the result of driving while impaired, speed, road rage, failing to wear seatbelts, distracted driving, failing to obey traffic signals/stop signs, etc......so obey traffic laws.

Transit Services Now Serving the Pueblo of Isleta

The Pueblo of Isleta and the Rio Metro Regional Transit District Working Together

Bus Route 208 (No Fares until further notice!)

Bus Route 208 connects the Pueblo of Isleta and Valencia County communities to the Alvarado Transportation Center (ATC) in Downtown Albuquerque during the morning/midday when the Rail Runner does not operate. Route 208 features three northbound trips arriving at the ATC at 9:30am, 11:00am and 1:30pm, and three southbound trips departing the ATC at 9:35am, 11:05am and 1:32pm. At the ATC, riders can transfer to ABQ RIDE bus routes.

Route 208 serves two bus stops on the Pueblo of Isleta. The stop closest to the village proper is located on NM 147 just east of the Rio Grande Bridge. Please do not park and leave vehicles unattended on the adjoining roads near this stop, as the bus and other vehicles use these roads to turnaround and access other locations. Route 208 also stops at the Isleta Pueblo Rail Runner Station, where riders can transfer to the Isleta Resort and Casino shuttle. Because the bus serves the station, riders can also consider using Route 208 in combination with the Rail Runner, for example, taking the bus to Downtown Albuquerque in the mid-morning and returning by train in the evening.

Please see route flyer that includes map, times of Bus Route 208. (No Fares until further notice!) Pueblo of Isleta Dial-a-Ride (No Fares until further notice!)

The Pueblo of Isleta Dial-a-Ride operates Monday through Friday from 8:15am to 2:45pm, providing trips within the Pueblo and to the ABQ RIDE Route 53 bus stop on NM 314. Service to places like Smiths, Albertsons and Wal-Mart in Los Lunas is also provided with requests made before noon at least one business day prior to your trip.

Request your Dial-a-Ride trip by calling Valencia County dispatch at (505) 352-3595 before noon at least one business day prior to your trip. Requests are accepted between 5:00am and 3:00pm Monday thru Friday. On the date and time of your trip, a wheelchair accessible van will arrive within 15 minutes of your scheduled pickup time. Trips may also be grouped together; riders should expect to travel with others.

For more information about both services, including a copy of the Route 208 schedule, visit riometro. org and select "Schedules" > "Bus" > "Pueblo of Isleta" from the grey bar near the top of the website. Schedules for Route 208 are also available at the Public Services Department Office at the Tribal Services Complex.



About Route 208

Bus route 208 provides three northbound and three southbound trips morning/midday between Valencia County, the Pueblo of Isleta, and Downtown Albuquerque when the Rail Runner does not operate. Riders are encouraged to use Route 208 in combination with the Rail Runner, for example, by taking the bus to Downtown Albuquerque midday and returning by train in the evening. Weekdays only.

ADA Accessible

All of our buses and trains are ADA compliant and are equipped with wheelchair lifts or ramps.







Why is It Important to Know the Names of My Medications?

Knowing the names of the medications you're taking is very important for your safety and overall health. Here's why:

1. Emergency Situations

In emergencies, it is important to know what medications you're on to avoid harmful interactions or duplicate treatments.

Avoid Drug Interactions

If you see different doctors or use multiple pharmacies, knowing your medications helps prevent dangerous drug interactions or duplication of treatments.

Correct Use

Knowing the names helps you:

- ☐ Take the right medication at the right time
- ☐ Avoid Mixing up medication that may look alike
- ☐ Follow the proper instructions (e.g. take with food, avoid alcohol)

Communicate with Healthcare Providers

Doctors, MA's, PA's, Nurses, Pharmacists and Pharmacy Technicians will ask what you're taking. Knowing the names helps you give accurate information and get the best care.

Track Side Effects or Allergies

If you have a reaction, knowing the medication name makes it easier to figure out what caused it and avoid it in the future

Refills:

You'll need medication names to:

- □ Request correct refills
- □ Verify prescriptions

Empowerment

Understanding what you are putting in your body helps you take control of your health and asked informed questions.

If it's overwhelming, you don't have to memorize everything - keeping a written or digital list of your medications (with names, doses, and why you take them) can be just as helpful.

Early Medication Refill(s)

We know that life can be unpredictable, and there are times when you may need to get your prescription filled earlier than usual. Whether you're planning a vacation or have experienced a lost or damaged prescription, it's important to understand our policy to ensure a smooth and timely process.

Early refills are for chronic medications only

This policy applies exclusively to your chronic, longterm prescription medications. Over-the counter (OTC), controlled substances and weight loss items are not eligible for early refills under this provision.

Two early refills per year

You are permitted a maximum of two early refills per calendar year for chronic medications. This can be for travel or lost or stolen medication.

After the annual limit

After you have used your two early refills for the year, you will have two options:

Transfer: You may transfer your prescriptions to another pharmacy. In this case, you will be responsible for any copay or out-of-pocket expense.

Wait: You may wait until your next refill is due to have it filled at IHC.

Keep it simple, if you do not see it on this flier throw it away in the trash. Do not use your blue recycle cart for trash or it will be confiscated. Have your cart out by 7am. For service schedule announcements check the POI newsletter & POI Facebook. (505) 869-4106

Your recyclables do not need to be bagged, however it is highly recommended to bag your recyclables for curbside pickup during windy season. This is to reduce the chance of creating litter due to winds. If you choose to bag your recyclables it is important to use clear bags only. Colored bags are not accepted at the recycling facility. When your recyclables are bagged in colored bags they are not opened up and your material is landfilled instead of recycled. Using clear bags helps to ensure the health and safety of the line workers who come in contact with the material when sorting at the recycle facility. Using colored bags will result in your recycles not being collected. This is important to sustain the recycle program moving forward. Your understanding and cooperation is greatly appreciated.

Protecting Elders: The Safety of COVID and Flu

Getting vaccinated against COVID-19 and influenza is very important for older adults. These vaccines help protect people from getting very sick, going to the hospital, or even passing away from these diseases. Staying up to date with vaccines helps keep elders, families, and the whole community safe.

Some people worry about feeling sick after getting a vaccine. It is normal to have mild side effects like a sore arm, tiredness, or a low fever. These are signs that the body is building protection. Feeling a little sick after a vaccine is not the same as having the actual disease. The vaccine cannot give you COVID-19 or the flu. These side effects usually go away in a day or two.

Getting vaccinated is one of the best ways to protect yourself and others. Elders are at higher risk for serious problems from COVID-19 and flu, but vaccines make these illnesses much less dangerous. By getting vaccinated, you help protect your family, your friends, and your community.

Staying healthy helps everyone, and vaccines are a safe and effective way to do that. If you have questions about vaccines or want to schedule your COVID or Flu vaccine for the 2025-2026 winter season, contact Isleta Health Center Medical Clinic at 505-869-4385. If you live on the Pueblo and would like to find out if you can get your vaccines at home, contact Public Health Nursing at 505-869-4890 or 505-869-5474.
