Subject: Fire Department Assistance on Approved Burn Days

Dear Community Members,

The safety and well-being of our Pueblo of Isleta residents remains a top priority. As part of our continued commitment to proactive fire prevention and community protection, the Isleta Fire Department is available to assist residents during approved burn days if there are concerns about conducting a field burn safely.

While it is not required to have the fire department present for a field burn, we recognize that conditions can change quickly. Having trained personnel available to stand by during a burn is a proactive measure designed to help prevent fires from getting out of control and to provide peace of mind to our residents. The only requirement for this assistance is that the burn takes place on an officially designated burn day.

If you are interested in having fire department personnel stand by during your field burn, please contact Chief Tafoya with the Isleta Fire Department at (505) 239-7661 to coordinate in advance. This effort reflects our shared responsibility to protect our lands, homes, and community members. By working together and taking proactive steps, we strengthen the safety and resilience of the Pueblo of Isleta.

**LETTER FROM THE EDITOR**

**DEADLINE for April Newsletter articles is set for Tuesday, March 17, 2026, at 4:30 pm.** Articles may be dropped off at the Library or emailed to Nathaniel.Lujan@isletapueblo.com. Should you email your article, expect a confirmation email. If you do not receive a confirmation email, odds are it never made it to me and then it's time to panic, so call Nate at 505.869.9808.

People who wish to submit an article or flyer are responsible for generating their own article or flyer. Should you need help, please call the Library at 505.869.9808 and set up a date and time to sit down with a Library staff member who will help you throughout the process. The Library will NOT accept notes dropped off at the Library or information over the phone to generate your article.

**PROBATES** need to be published in the Newsletter for two consecutive months. Probates are considered court documents, therefore, all submitters must provide: 1) Name of Deceased, 2) Date of Deceased 3) Court Case #, and 4) Date of Court Date. A Probate form can be found on the Newsletter Archive page at <http://www.isletapueblo.com/newsletters.html>.

**CLASSIFIED ADS:** The new administration has requested that the Newsletter start a Classified Ad section for Tribal members selling land, houses, mobile homes, vehicles, and farm equipment. Leasing of houses and mobile homes will be accepted. Smaller items that can be sold at the local flea markets or weekly yard sales will NOT be accepted.

Currently, this service is FREE to Tribal members. Land, houses, and mobile homes must be within the reservation boundaries. Ads must meet the 160-character limit. Ads that exceed the 160-characters will NOT be submitted to the Newsletter. A single picture may be submitted with the ad. Submitters of classified ads are responsible for generating their ads as this is a FREE service.

As a reminder, Tribal business owners may submit a small flyer at no charge. Like the classified ads, business owners are responsible for generating their flyers as this is a FREE service.

Classified ads and business flyers will be posted no more than two consecutive months. In the event that the Newsletter may exceed the 24-page limit, classified ads and business flyers will be "bumped" for newsletter articles. Again, this is a FREE service for Tribal members.

The Isleta Newsletter is owned and operated by the Pueblo of Isleta. Therefore, the Governor of the Pueblo of Isleta has the final say in all articles and contents within the Isleta Newsletter.

## POI BROADBAND

The Pueblo of Isleta Broadband Initiative is making significant strides toward delivering high speed internet access to the community, with ongoing progress in conduit installation, fiber placement, and preparation for critical network infrastructure.



As part of Phase I on the Westside of the Rio Grande, construction teams have surpassed key milestones that lay the groundwork for a modern, resilient fiber network serving all tribal members. A total of 113,332 feet of conduit — approximately 21.47 miles — has been successfully placed. Crews have also placed 33,371 feet of fiber optic cable, equal to 6.32 miles, ensuring the network build is transitioning fully into the fiber installation phase along with 58 splice enclosures, enabling active fiber splicing.

Phase II — focused on the Eastside of the Rio Grande — is scheduled to begin construction soon. This phase will expand backbone connectivity across the Pueblo and bring service routes to more homes, facilities, and community assets. Preparations are also underway for the Palace West (Headend), the central facility that will house core network switches, routers, and monitoring systems, positioning the Pueblo for successful network activation and long term scalability.

This progress would not have been possible without the leadership and support of the Tribal Council and Administration. Their vision, commitment, and guidance have been instrumental in moving the Broadband Initiative forward and closing the digital divide for the Pueblo of Isleta.

Happy Spring,

We hope you are ready to spring forward into time change on March 8th, 2026. We all know the struggle of getting used to time changes, especially when it goes forward. Here are some tips to make it a little easier when the time change occurs.

- In the days before the time change, gradually adjust your bedtime and wake-up time by 15 minutes each day to ease the transition.
- Get outside in the morning to expose yourself to natural light, which helps regulate your body's natural rhythm.
- Stick to a regular sleep schedule, even on weekends, and create a relaxing bedtime routine.
- If you need to nap, keep them short and early in the day to avoid disrupting your nighttime sleep.
- Avoid caffeine close to bedtime as it can interfere with sleep.

This group is made up of partners in Valencia County that offer services to students who attend Valencia County schools. The Truancy Department has been active participants for approximately 15 years. We meet monthly and discuss the importance of school attendance, the barriers, ways to encourage daily attendance and how to support those families that are addressing various barriers that interfere with their children's daily school attendance. We'd also like to say thank you to the Los Lunas Native American Club who attended this event and shared dances and songs; it was amazing to see the support these students received from the community and especially from their families.

Keep in mind that the Truancy Department is here to assist our families not only during the school year but all year. Please contact our office if you have any questions or concerns regarding your child's school attendance.

# ISLETA POLICE DEPARTMENT

MARCH 2026



The idiom, "March in like a lion, out like a lamb" defines the unpredictable and transitional nature of March weather. As it is a traditional weather proverb indicating if March begins with stormy, cold, and harsh weather (a lion), it will end with mild, calm, and sunny spring-like weather (a lamb), or vice-versa. Recorded as early as 1732, it represents the transition from winter to spring and is sometimes associated with the constellations Leo and Aries.

May I say as of the writing of the article, the winds are here in full force and Punxsutawney Phil may have been correct in part of his February 2, 2026, prediction of more winter-like weather lingering. The wonderfully warm spring-like weather quickly changed to windy, cold, rainy/snow in areas of New Mexico..... but it is New Mexico so wait a bit and the weather will change again.

With the anticipation of our "windy season", as always, we ask everyone to be aware and be prepared. The high winds in an open area can be dangerous to everyone travelling so motorists, please be alerted to changing weather conditions and be prepared for high winds, dust, low visibility and other motorists. High profile vehicles are highly susceptible to a strong gust of wind and can be pushed into another lane without warning so be a defensive driver and pay attention to the road.

### IHSP TRAFFIC DIVISION

A DWI checkpoint was conducted the latter part of February and others are planned throughout the year as well as patrol saturation projects so drivers be aware and be prepared. Be sure to maintain proper documentation in the vehicle which includes current registration, proof of current insurance, a current driver's license, etc. Officers have encountered many drivers who have presented expired documents stating it's the same insurance policy number or I haven't received my new registration documents. Renewals for registration can be completed online and a temporary, printable document is available until the actual registration document with sticker arrive. Insurance cards are provided by the agencies online and most are printable. Please remember, the responsibility falls upon the driver, whether it is your vehicle or not, to be sure all current documents are available upon demand, if you are stopped. Digital (current) copies are allowable, but again, they must be current. Driver's licenses should be current and valid with current address information. State traffic laws require the change of address to be completed within ten (10) days of moving to a new address and if relocating from another state, you have thirty days to register your vehicle in New Mexico.

Most importantly, obey ALL traffic laws: Wear your seatbelts, make sure children are in appropriate car seats, don't speed, obey all traffic controls (stop signs/traffic lights) and

### TRAINING

The Isleta Police Department continually strives in providing training for officers and dispatchers in addition to the requirements set out in our State/BIA required trainings annually.

Our department is proud to announce the launch of a new Virtual Reality (VR) training system designed to strengthen officer decision-making, enhance mental health response skills, and ensure responsible use of force practices. This modern training tool places officers in highly realistic, interactive scenarios that mirror the complex situations they may encounter in the field.

The VR platform allows officers to practice split-second decision-making in a safe, controlled environment. Scenarios range from routine encounters to high-stress situations, including mental health crises, domestic disturbances, and potential use-of-force incidents. By repeatedly working through these situations, officers build stronger judgment, improve situational awareness, and learn to identify the best possible outcomes under pressure. This equipment allows officers to train in the specific demands of public safety, such as Driving Under the Influence, traffic stops, and consensual contacts with the public.

A key focus of the new system is improving responses to individuals experiencing mental health challenges. Officers can practice communication, de-escalation, and crisis intervention techniques with virtual subjects that react in real time. This helps reinforce calm, measured approaches that prioritize safety and compassion. The training also supports responsible use of force decision-making. Officers are guided through shoot/no-shoot scenarios that require them to accurately evaluate threats, consider alternatives, and consistently apply department policies. The system provides detailed feedback on reaction time, verbal commands, positioning, and overall decision patterns, giving officers and instructors valuable insight into performance and growth.

By adopting this advanced training technology, our department is investing in better-prepared officers and a safer community. This upgrade reflects our ongoing commitment to transparency, accountability, and continuous improvement in the way we serve the public.

## Why is It Important to Know the Names of My Medications?

Knowing the names of the medications you're taking is very important for your safety and overall health. Here's why:

1. **Emergency Situations**  
In emergencies, it is important to know what medications you're on to avoid harmful interactions or duplicate treatments.
2. **Avoid Drug Interactions**  
If you see different doctors or use multiple pharmacies, knowing your medications helps prevent dangerous drug interactions or duplication of treatments.
3. **Correct Use**  
Knowing the names helps you:
  - Take the right medication at the right time
  - Avoid Mixing up medication that may look alike
  - Follow the proper instructions (e.g. take with food, avoid alcohol)
4. **Communicate with Healthcare Providers**  
Doctors, MA's, PA's, Nurses, Pharmacists and Pharmacy Technicians will ask what you're taking. Knowing the names helps you give accurate information and get the best care.
5. **Track Side Effects or Allergies**  
If you have a reaction, knowing the medication name makes it easier to figure out what caused it and avoid it in the future
6. **Refills:**  
You'll need medication names to:
  - Request correct refills
  - Verify prescriptions
7. **Empowerment**  
Understanding what you are putting in your body helps you take control of your health and asked informed questions.

If it's overwhelming, you don't have to memorize everything – keeping a written or digital list of your medications (with names, doses, and why you take them) can be just as helpful.

### Early Medication Refill(s)

We know that life can be unpredictable, and there are times when you may need to get your prescription filled earlier than usual. Whether you're planning a vacation or have experienced a lost or damaged prescription, it's important to understand our policy to ensure a smooth and timely process.

### Early refills are for chronic medications only

This policy applies exclusively to your chronic, long-term prescription medications. Over-the counter (OTC), controlled substances and weight loss items are not eligible for early refills under this provision.

### Two early refills per year

You are permitted a maximum of two early refills per calendar year for chronic medications. This can be for travel or lost or stolen medication.

### After the annual limit

After you have used your two early refills for the year, you will have two options:

**Transfer:** You may transfer your prescriptions to another pharmacy. In this case, you will be responsible for any co-pay or out-of-pocket expense.

**Wait:** You may wait until your next refill is due to have it filled at IHC.

### What is Cerebral Palsy?

Cerebral Palsy is a brain disorder that affects muscle movement and development. It is caused by abnormal development or damage to certain parts of the brain that involve motor control. It may occur before, during or after birth. There are three types that can affect different parts of the body. It is usually diagnosed in early childhood. Causes include genetics, infections of the nervous system, premature birth, and birth complications. After birth, it may be injury-related. Symptoms of Cerebral Palsy involve problems with muscle growth and movement, issues with fine motor skills, complications with hearing and vision, delayed milestones, and other developmental delays. It is a lifelong condition and incurable but treatable. Treatments include physical therapy, occupational and speech therapy, medicines, and surgery.

Why should all U.S. children and teens continue to follow the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) recommended vaccine schedule?

Following the AAP schedule helps babies, children and teens stay ahead of serious, preventable diseases such as measles and pertussis (whooping cough), as well as the fall respiratory viruses respiratory syncytial virus (RSV), influenza and COVID.

The AAP immunization schedule is considered the ideal timeline for healthy children as their immune system develops. When everyone is vaccinated, diseases have a hard time spreading. It helps keep your child healthy while also protecting others in the community.

There are very few reasons to vary from the AAP recommended immunization schedule. If you're wondering if your child requires an alternative immunization schedule, make an appointment to talk with your medical provider.

Why is the AAP immunization schedule different from the federal schedule?

In January 2026, federal officials suddenly stopped recommending several childhood vaccines. They did this despite decades of extensive research proving that these vaccines are safe. The AAP, the New Mexico Department of Health, and all of the Isleta Health Center physicians continue to recommend that U.S. children be immunized against these diseases.

## ISLETA ELDER CENTER - ADULT DAY CARE SERVICES

It is common knowledge that elder care is one of the fastest-growing areas in the healthcare industry, with a demand that skyrocketed in the last five years. The country will continue to see an increasing demand for elder care services in the coming years due to a rapidly growing elderly population.

The elderly population is in dire need of facilities providing elder care services. In the past, elderly people and their families preferred traditional nursing homes or community-based alternatives. The needs of the elderly population are dynamic. There is an increased need for home and

community-based elder care providers that can provide elders with adult day services whenever the primary caregiver is not available.

Fortunately, located here in Isleta is the POI Adult Day Services (ADS) which provides participants with a full day of services Monday through Friday. Services such as meals, basic health care and health assessments, assistance with appointments and activities of daily living (ADL). The Adult Day Services also provides transportation, care coordination as well as therapeutic, recreational and socialization activities. In a nutshell, it is a comfortable

place where our elders spend the day participating in health-seeking activities, while their caregivers are at work, running errands, or enjoying a well-deserved rest and relaxation. It is a compassionate and safe environment for the elderly and is considered a home away from home for some elderly.

We are here to support families in the care of their loved one Monday through Friday, 9:00am to 3:00pm.

**MARCH 9-14 IS SLEEP AWARENESS WEEK.**



**How to Get Healthy Sleep.**  
Getting a good night's sleep every night is vital to your heart and brain health. Prioritizing your sleep health by taking action in the month of March to remind yourself to get enough rest. It serves as a reminder of our sleep's foundational role for our physical, mental wellness, and daily functioning. Although, sleep disorders can be challenging and can interfere with healthy sleep and affect lives of up to 10 million people in the U.S. The most common are insomnia, narcolepsy, restless legs syndrome and sleep apnea.

Developing poor sleep habits can contribute to risk factors for cardiovascular health and put you at higher risk for:

- Obesity
- High blood pressure, blood sugar and cholesterol
- Diabetes
- Stress
- Inflammation
- Depression and anxiety

Adults and adolescents should aim for an average of 7-9 hours. Babies and kids need more depending on their age. However, many people can find getting enough rest challenging. Busy schedules, chronic pain, stress, poor sleeping environments, and mental health conditions can interfere with the ability to fall asleep and remain asleep.

**How Sleep Affects Your Health.** Sleep is an important time for your brain to reset. Regular, restful sleep is important to keep your brain running smoothly.

**Be Mindful of Substance Use.** Alcohol, nicotine, and caffeine can be factors of disruption of sleep quality. These are stimulants that remain active in the bloodstream for a length of time after consumption, which can interfere with sleep quality.

**Benefits of sleep:**

- **BETTER BRAIN FUNCTION**—including alertness, decision-making, focus, learning, memory, reasoning and problem-solving.
- **IMPROVED**—mood and energy.
- **STRONGER**—immune system.
- **HEALING**—and repairing cells, tissues and blood vessels.
- **LESS RISK**—of chronic disease.

**TIPS for SUCCESS:**

**DIM IT.**  
Dimming the lights before sleep helps signal to your brain that it's time to wind down. Dim your screen. The bright blue light of most devices can mess with your "internal clock" and melatonin production, a hormone that regulates sleep.

**SET IT.**  
Go to bed and wake up at the same time every day. This helps regulate your body's internal clock and makes it easier to fall asleep and wake up naturally.

**BLOCK IT.**  
Establish a nighttime routine. Spend 20-30 minutes winding down before bed. Avoid screens. Put your phone on "do not disturb" mode to block it all out when you're trying to sleep.

Working on computers, scrolling through news feeds, or playing video games before bedtime can overstimulate the mind, making it difficult to achieve falling asleep.
