Subject: Fire Department Assistance on Approved Burn Days

Dear Community Members,

The safety and well-being of our Pueblo of Isleta residents remains a top priority. As part of our continued commitment to proactive fire prevention and community protection, the Isleta Fire Department is available to assist residents during approved burn days if there are concerns about conducting a field burn safely.

While it is not required to have the fire department present for a field burn, we recognize that conditions can change quickly. Having trained personnel available to stand by during a burn is a proactive measure designed to help prevent fires from getting out of control and to provide peace of mind to our residents. The only requirement for this assistance is that the burn takes place on an officially designated burn day.

If you are interested in having fire department personnel stand by during your field burn, please contact Chief Tafoya with the Isleta Fire Department at (505) 239-7661 to coordinate in advance. This effort reflects our shared responsibility to protect our lands, homes, and community members. By working together and taking proactive steps, we strengthen the safety and resilience of the Pueblo of Isleta.

LETTER FROM THE EDITOR

DEADLINE for June Newsletter articles is set for Tuesday, May 19, 2026, at 4:30 pm. Articles may be dropped off at the Library or emailed to Nathaniel.Lujan@isletapueblo.com. Should you email your article, expect a confirmation email. If you do not receive a confirmation email, odds are it never made it to me and then it's time to panic, so call Nate at 505.869.9808.

People who wish to submit an article or flyer are responsible for generating their own article or flyer. Should you need help, please call the Library at 505.869.9808 and set up a date and time to sit down with a Library staff member who will help you throughout the process. The Library will NOT accept notes dropped off at the Library or information over the phone to generate your article.

PROBATES need to be published in the Newsletter for two consecutive months. Probates are considered court documents, therefore, all submitters must provide: 1) Name of Deceased, 2) Date of Deceased 3) Court Case #, and 4) Date of Court Date. A Probate form can be found on the Newsletter Archive page at <http://www.isletapueblo.com/newsletters.html>.

CLASSIFIED ADS: The new administration has requested that the Newsletter start a Classified Ad section for Tribal members selling land, houses, mobile homes, vehicles, and farm equipment. Leasing of houses and mobile homes will be accepted. Smaller items that can be sold at the local flea markets or weekly yard sales will NOT be accepted.

Currently, this service is FREE to Tribal members. Land, houses, and mobile homes must be within the reservation boundaries. Ads must meet the 160-character limit. Ads that exceed the 160-characters will NOT be submitted to the Newsletter. A single picture may be submitted with the ad. Submitters of classified ads are responsible for generating their ads as this is a FREE service.

As a reminder, Tribal business owners may submit a small flyer at no charge. Like the classified ads, business owners are responsible for generating their flyers as this is a FREE service.

Classified ads and business flyers will be posted no more than two consecutive months. In the event that the Newsletter may exceed the 24-page limit, classified ads and business flyers will be "bumped" for newsletter articles. Again, this is a FREE service for Tribal members.

The Isleta Newsletter is owned and operated by the Pueblo of Isleta. Therefore, the Governor of the Pueblo of Isleta has the final say in all articles and contents within the Isleta Newsletter.

05-07**PUEBLO OF ISLETA NUISANCE CODE****05-07-01. General Provisions**

A. Short Title. This chapter shall be titled the Pueblo of Isleta Nuisance Code.

05-07-02. Civil Nuisances – Prohibited

A. The following constitute a prohibited nuisance subject to enforcement under this chapter, enacted upon the sovereign and inherent authority of the Pueblo of Isleta upon a finding by the Governor or the Governor's designee, that such activity or property condition causes unreasonable and significant interference with another person's interest in the use and enjoyment of their property. The location, character and habits of the particular region where the alleged nuisance is located are to be taken into account in determining what is unreasonable and significant to an individual living in it. If persons living in the region would regard the invasion as definitely offensive, seriously annoying or intolerable, it is significant. If most persons in the locality would not be substantially annoyed or disturbed, the invasion is not significant, even though the idiosyncrasies of the particular complainant may make it unendurable to him. This code shall apply to all persons and activities on the Pueblo of Isleta. Within the Pueblo of Isleta Village proper, this code will be strictly enforced to protect the beauty and sacred nature of our Village.

i. Noise Nuisance.

1. Repeated and unreasonable excessive noise from construction, industrial activities, or loud parties, unless approved by the Governor.
2. Excessive vehicular or motorcycle noise, including but not limited to noise due to the use of jake brakes, which are completely prohibited from use on the Pueblo of Isleta except for in cases of emergency, and modification to or improper function of a vehicle's muffler, and excessively loud stereo systems.
3. Habitual or excessive barking dogs or other disruptive animal noises within the exterior boundaries of the Pueblo of Isleta.

ii. Public Health and Safety Nuisance.

1. Improper disposal of waste and/or dumping including but not limited to asbestos, animal remains, or hazardous materials as defined by federal law, raw sewage, municipal solid waste (trash), construction and demolition debris.
2. Neglected or dilapidated properties that pose health or safety risks including broken windows, unsafe structures and building code

violations including fire hazards.

3. Any obstructions of sidewalks or roads that impedes public or private roadways or precludes safe passage.

4. Disruptive parties, gatherings, or events not approved by the Governor, that disturb the peace and safety of a neighborhood.

iii. Property Nuisance.

1. Overgrown vegetation, weeds, or "white goods" in yard (refrigerators, stoves and other appliances) or unkept yards.
2. Abandoned or derelict buildings.
3. Graffiti and vandalism that has not been cleaned up by the property owner.
4. Abandoned or inoperable vehicles or equipment on public or private property.
5. Excessive or intrusive outdoor lighting.
6. Leaking barrels containing petroleum, or other toxic liquid, motor vehicle waste including but not limited to oil, batteries or similar waste.

iv. Environmental Nuisance.

1. Air or water pollution that exceeds applicable environmental quality standards.
2. Inadequate waste management or recycling. If solid waste removal is requested from the Pueblo of Isleta, a fee may be associated with this service, towing services or any other services requested from the Pueblo of Isleta..
3. Discharge from vehicles or equipment, including industrial or farm equipment.
4. Offensive or noxious odors emanating from industrial, agricultural, or residential sources.

v. Public Nuisance.

1. Any activity or condition that substantially interferes with the public's right to use and enjoy public spaces.

B. Nothing hereunder shall limit the Pueblo's criminal law enforcement authorities in relation to any nuisance conduct after a reasonable correction period which shall not exceed 90 days.

05-07-03. Exceptions

A. The following shall not constitute a nuisance under this Code:

- i. Any activity, property condition, or land-use by the Pueblo of Isleta or its entities.
- ii. Any activity, property condition, or land-use explicitly permitted by the Tribal Council or the Governor, including but not limited to through special use zoning permits authorized by the Tribal Council and Permit Authorizations to Enter authorized by the Governor, unless it violates the health and safety of the community.

iii. Emergency response activities.

iv. Cultural, traditional, and religious events.

v. Property uses consistent with the Pueblo of Isleta Zoning Code.

05-07-04. Enforcement and Penalties.

A. The Governor or the Governor's designees shall determine whether conduct or property conditions constitutes a civil nuisance hereunder. Violations may include a civil citation from the Isleta Police Department and will also provide authority for the legal department to bring court action for injunctive relief from the Isleta Tribal Court.

B. Upon a determination by the Governor or the Governor's designee, that conduct or property condition constitutes a civil nuisance hereunder, the following enforcement actions may proceed:

- i. A Notice of Violation shall be issued by the Governor or the Governor's designee with a correction period. The Notice of Violation shall describe the nature of the nuisance, state the specific ordinance section that has been violated, provide a reasonable correction period, describe the abatement that is mandated during the correction period, and describe criminal and civil enforcement actions which may proceed upon the violator's failure to correct.

ii. If the violator does not abate the nuisance during the provided correction period, then any of the following penalties may result:

1. The Isleta Legal Department may issue a civil citation of \$250 per day of the ongoing nuisance for up to thirty calendar days after consultation with the Pueblo of Isleta legal department;
2. The Pueblo may take direct action to abate the nuisance in order to rectify public health or safety concerns, including structure demolition or remediation. The costs of such remediation may be assessed against the violator;
3. The Code Enforcement Officer may direct a forcible entry and detainer action against the violator in Isleta Tribal Court to seek a Writ of Restitution to evict them from the property; and/or
4. The Code Enforcement Officer may direct a civil penalty legal action against the violator in Isleta Tribal Court to seek an injunction, civil penalties, and other authorized relief.

St. Augustine The Sacrament of Baptism

Parents are responsible for bringing their child to the Sacrament of Baptism as soon after birth as possible. Except in case of necessity, the church is the usual place of baptism. By definition infants are those who have not yet reached the age of reason (7 years old) and cannot have or profess their own faith. All others are to be considered minors or adults, and the rites and policies of the Order of Christian Initiation (OCIA) must be followed. In order that a child be baptized it is necessary that the parents consent, or at least one of them, and that there is reasonable hope that the child will be brought up in the Catholic Faith. If the hope does not exist, the baptism is to be delayed for a period of time so that the practice of the faith may be encouraged. At least one parent of the child to be baptized must be registered with St. Augustine Parish. If you are not already registered, please do so as soon as possible.

In the Baptismal Rite, the priest asks the child's parents this question:

"You have asked to have your child baptized. In doing so you are accepting the responsibility of training your child in the practice of the faith. It will be your duty to bring him/her up to keep God's commandments as Christ taught us, by loving God and our neighbor. Do you clearly understand what you are undertaking?"

That may be a difficult question to answer, especially for first time parents. There are so many new responsibilities with a child that sometimes it is overwhelming to consider how to meet all the child's needs. Baptism of children requires special care and understanding since a child does not know what is happening at the Baptism. Baptism is not a one-time event; you are committing your child to a way of life in the Catholic faith. Because our priests have a responsibility for determining the parents' readiness for the celebration of the sacrament, we invite you to really reflect on what Baptism means to you and how you will teach your child about Jesus Christ. Contemplating your child's Baptism will also help you to reflect on how you are living your baptismal responsibilities in the faith life of the Church. Some questions to ask yourself:

- What does baptism mean to me?
- Do I participate in Mass to worship God every week?
- What is my involvement in the parish?
- How will I grow in my faith so to pass on the faith to my child?
- What are some practical ways I will teach my child about the Catholic faith?

Selecting Godparents for your Child –

Many times parents inquire as to whom should serve as godparents for their child. Being a godparent is not just an honor given to a good friend or relative. It implies that the person has a real appreciation of the Catholic faith, a practice of the same, and a sense of responsibility toward the child and parents. What does a sponsor do? A baptism sponsor strives: To pray for the child regularly. To be a model of love, care, and Christ-centered faith for the child. To encourage and assist the child in his/her relationship with Jesus. To be a regular presence in the life of the child. To remember the child on baptism anniversaries and other holidays.

You are to select two Catholic Godparents, one male and one female. No more than two godparents are permitted, and it is prohibited to have either two male or two female godparents.

Because of the great responsibilities of a godparent, the Catholic Church has some minimum requirements it asks of all godparents set forth by the Code of Canon Law (Can. 873-874):

- Be at least 16 years old.
- Have received the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist.
- If married, be married according to the laws of the Church; if single, not living in cohabitation.
- Be active in the practice of the faith and receiving the sacraments regularly
- Not be the father or mother of the one being baptized

Baptisms at St. Augustine Parish will be held the third and fourth Saturday of each month beginning July 2026. Baptisms in June will be held on Saturday June 13th and Saturday June 27th. Baptisms are not held during Lent and Advent. It is the responsibility of the parents to pick up registration forms from the parish office. Pueblo of Isleta Secures Funding for Road Maintenance and Transportation Safety Assessments

The Pueblo of Isleta Transportation Services Department is pleased to announce the award of two grants that will support roadway maintenance and improve safety for the community.


Through the NMDOT State Road Fund, former Transportation Secretary Ricky Serna awarded \$320,000 for maintenance work on TR 2. The project will include mill and inlay, along with new pavement markings, and is scheduled for late summer 2026 with an expected duration of approximately one week. Traffic control will be in place, and roadway users should anticipate minor delays during construction. This work will extend the life of the roadway and improve driving conditions. Additional project details will be shared as construction approaches.

In addition, the Pueblo has been awarded funding through the Federal Highway Administration's Tribal Transportation Program Safety Fund (TTPSF) to conduct a Road Safety Audit (RSA) along NM 47, from Exit 215 to Bosque Farms. This project was identified as the top priority in the Pueblo's Transportation Safety Plan, adopted by Tribal Council in early 2025, based on crash data and safety concerns at key intersections.

The study will evaluate roadway conditions and safety performance, resulting in a comprehensive Road Safety Assessment Report. The report will include a prioritized list of recommended improvements for NM 47 and the 14 intersections within the study area. These findings will support future funding applications to implement safety enhancements.

This award is part of a broader federal initiative through the U.S. Department of Transportation, which has provided over \$21 million to tribes nationwide to reduce roadway fatalities and serious injuries. Opportunities for public input and community meetings will be offered throughout the study.

TRUANCY

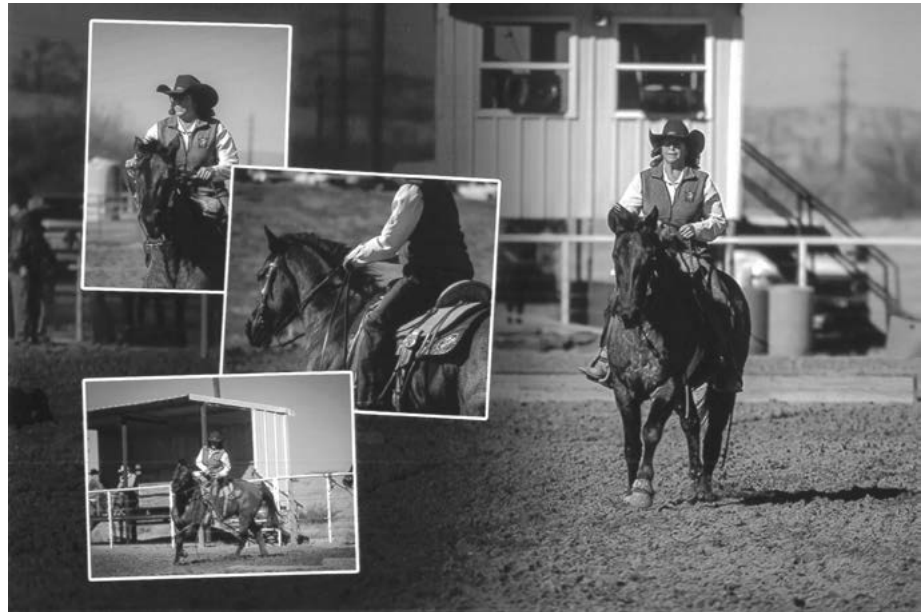

The amended Pueblo of Isleta Business Permit Code is now in effect. The business permit classes and fees have been updated. Additionally, terms and conditions for business permits have been amended. Copies of the Business Permit Code is available at the Governor’s Office. Additionally, the code can be found in Section 05-04-01 of the Pueblo of Isleta Law and Order Code, available on the POI website at <https://tinyurl.com/4czsbvpz>.

If you have already paid your 2026 Business Permit fee and your payment was more than the current required fee, the Governor’s Office will contact you directly regarding a partial refund. If you have any additional questions or concerns, please contact the Governor’s Office at (505) 869-3111.

Insecticide will be applied with hand sprayers in Recreation locations, limited to grassy areas and athletic fields, plus artificial turf at Isleta Head Start. A sign will be posted on nearby park fencing each day an area is sprayed. The first application is planned to take place March 27, 2026 and will be repeated approximately every 3 weeks. People and pets may re-enter a treated area when the treated grass or turf is dry.

Why should all U.S. children and teens continue to follow the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) recommended vaccine schedule?

Following the AAP schedule helps babies, children and teens stay ahead of serious, preventable diseases such as measles and pertussis (whooping cough), as well as the fall respiratory viruses respiratory syncytial virus (RSV), influenza and COVID.

The AAP immunization schedule is considered the ideal timeline for healthy children as their immune system develops. When everyone is vaccinated, diseases have a hard time spreading. It helps keep your child healthy while also protecting others in the community.

There are very few reasons to vary from the AAP recommended immunization schedule. If you're wondering if your child requires an alternative immunization schedule, make an appointment to talk with your medical provider.

Why is the AAP immunization schedule different from the federal schedule?

In January 2026, federal officials suddenly stopped recommending several childhood vaccines. They did this despite decades of extensive research proving that these vaccines are safe. **The AAP, the New Mexico Department of Health, and all of the Isleta Health Center physicians continue to recommend** that U.S. children be immunized against these diseases.

Safety Concerns of Dietary Supplements

What are dietary supplements?

Dietary supplements are products taken to support health. They come in pills, powders, teas, gummies, or liquids. They are taken for a variety of reasons, such as:

- Supporting joint and bone health (collagen, calcium)
- Supplementing diet when food intake is limited (low appetite or dietary restrictions)
- Helping with digestive problems (probiotics)

Supplements can be helpful but can also be harmful.

Dietary Supplement Concerns

The government regulates prescription medicines but not supplements. Medicines go through years of testing. They need government approval before being sold. Supplements do not. Therefore, companies do not have to prove their supplements are safe.

Supplements may contain:

- Heavy metals, such as lead and arsenic.
- Hidden drugs.
- Fillers or ingredients not listed on the label (e.g. rice flour or houseplants).
- Contaminants, such as mold.

Some supplements interact with prescription medications:

- Turmeric, garlic, and ginkgo can increase bleeding risk.
- Nicotinic acid (vitamin B3) can raise blood sugar levels.
- Grapefruit and St. John's wort affect the efficacy of many medications.

How can I choose a safe supplement?



Look for these labels. They mean that third-party companies test supplements for safety. USP and NSF are stricter than Labdoor and Trustified, but all of them are helpful.

Talk with your providers!

Providers can:


- Help you avoid harmful medication interactions.
- Ensure you are taking the right dosages.
- Support safe, informed choices.

Reporting Problems or Bad Reactions

Stop taking the supplement if you do not feel right or have adverse side effects (hives, chest pain, severe muscle pain, stroke, etc.).

You can submit a report online through the FDA's Safety Reporting Portal. This is important because it will let others know about supplement side effects.





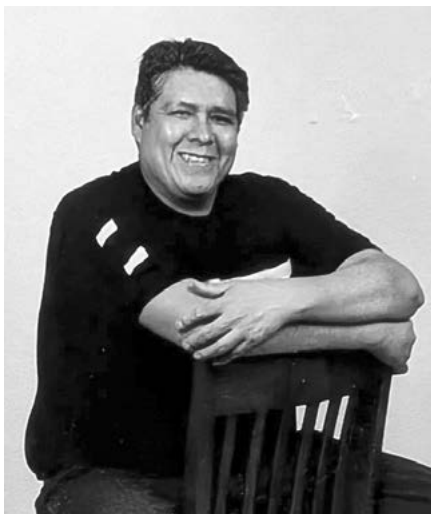

Don't Wait: Schedule Your Follow-Up After Hospital or ER Visits

Why Follow-Up Care Matters

After you leave the hospital or emergency room, your care isn't finished. Follow-up appointments are a critical part of your recovery and help prevent serious complications. Studies show that patients who see their doctor after discharge have better outcomes, including lower risk of death and fewer health problems.

What Can Happen Without Follow-Up?

Without proper follow-up care, you may be at higher risk for:

- Returning to the emergency room
- Being readmitted to the hospital
- Medication errors or confusion about your treatment plan
- Worsening of your condition
- Missing important test results

Research shows that nearly half of patients who return to the hospital within 30 days never saw a doctor between visits. Many of these readmissions could have been prevented with timely follow-up care.

Take Action: Call to Schedule


Please call 505-869-4494 on the first business day after your hospital or ER visit to schedule your follow-up appointment. We will do our best to schedule you with your primary care provider.

Important: Even if hospital staff told you they would schedule an appointment for you at Isleta Health Center, this often doesn't happen due to communication gaps between facilities. Don't wait for a call—take charge of your health and call us directly.

Your follow-up visit allows your doctor to:

- Review what happened during your hospital stay
- Check your medications and make any needed changes
- Answer your questions
- Monitor your recovery
- Catch problems early before they become serious

Remember: One phone call can make a big difference in your recovery. Call 505-869-4494 the first business day after discharge.












